HEALTH & SOCIAL CARE





This term, Year 11 Health & Social Care students took part in a range of activities in conjunction with the Public Health Agency's 'Care in the sun' campaign which was launched on 5th June 2023. This campaign focuses on the importance of getting the best from your sunscreen and reducing your risk of skin cancer. During class on Friday, students discussed the tips suggested by the PHA and DOH on how to keep safe in the sun. Furthermore, they had an opportunity to view several types and brands of sun protection, along with receiving guidance on the recommended coverage for each product.



Top tips for protecting your skin from cancer

- Stay in the shade between 11.00am and 3.00pm, when UV rays are strongest.
- Cover up with suitable clothing.
- Wear a broad brimmed hat and sunglasses with 100% UV protection.
- Buy sunglasses that have a CE mark or carry British Standard BS EN ISO 12312-1.
- Use sunscreen on exposed skin; an SPF of at least 15 and UVA 4 stars as recommended by the Department of Health and National Institute for Health and Care Excellence.
- Babies under six months should stay out of direct sunlight. If exposure to sunlight is unavoidable, apply a small amount of high protection sunscreen to exposed areas, such as the cheeks and back of the hands. For children over six months choose SPF 30 or SPF 50 to protect against UVB rays and minimum UVA 4 stars. Higher SPF will give more protection.
- Avoid sunburn by never allowing your skin to go pink or red in the sun. Sunburn doesn't have to be raw, peeling or blistering skin; for people with darker skin it might feel tender, irritated or itchy.
- Choose and use the correct amount of sunscreen – an adult needs six teaspoons distributed evenly on the body with an SPF of at least 15 and UVA 4 or 5 stars.
- Avoid sunbeds – they can cause over exposure to UV radiation.

Our talented Year 11 pupils have been perfecting their solo pieces for the performance unit in their Creative Arts course and have been doing this with great success.





HISTORY DEPARTMENT

The History department has had a busy year. In Year 8 we have enjoyed learning about The Normans in Britain and Ireland as well as the Black Death. A big well done to 8LD who produced fantastic projects on John De Courcy. This has also helped them develop their historical research skills.



Year 9 whizzed through several centuries of change by studying the Reformation, The Tudors, The Spanish Armada, Flight of the Earls, The Plantation of Ulster and The Famine.

Again, the homework projects on The Glorious Revolution were completed to a high standard with some pupils being able to link family members to the time. Year 10 have been studying significant events of the C20th and exploring how these have impacted life in the C20th.

In particular, Year 10 should be commended for their homework projects on The Battle of The Somme. It was fascinating to learn that many of our students' Great-Grandfathers, Grandfathers, Great Uncles, and other family members took part in this historic Battle. They described in detail their roles within the 36 Ulster Division and 16th Division included letters, pictures, army regalia, medals and even newspapers from this time. The students highlighted the pivoted role they played in this battle and WWI. Thank you to all parents, carers and guardians who supported our students during this time. We also said goodbye to our lovely year 12 GCSE class and wish them all the best in their future endeavours.




Our Year 11 intrepid historians have made a good start to their course and had the opportunity to listen to Lesley Urbach tell us the story of her family and their struggle during the Holocaust. We also went on a fact-finding mission to the Ulster Museum and visited the Troubles gallery to find out more about the Northern Ireland Troubles.

'What is Psychology?' is something the younger students often ask when they see that this is a subject offered at our school (and no, we don't learn how to read people's minds in room 18). Rather, it is the scientific study of the human mind and behaviour and is currently the second most popular subject to study at University in the UK. At Breda Academy, our year 13 and 14 students learn about a range of psychological theories and debates, including: criminal and forensic psychology, health psychology, aggression, consumer behaviour, gender and how to plan, conduct and write up their own research. If you have any questions about this subject please speak to Ms McMullan. Some of our year 13 students (above) told us what they most enjoyed learning about this year.

'Something I learned in psychology, which I didn't know before, was that your younger life can have a major impact upon what you grow up to be. For example, certain environments may lead you to becoming a more aggressive and violent person when you are an adult.' (Shakira)

'I learned about operant conditioning which is a method of learning that uses rewards and punishments to modify behaviour. Through operant conditioning, behaviour that is rewarded is likely to be repeated and behaviour that is punished may decrease. This is what I enjoyed learning the most.' (Junior)

'I have learnt many different things, but the thing that stuck out the most to me is that there are many different causes of people's behaviour and there is no one reason to explain why we behave the way we do.' (Julia)

'I have learnt about how your surroundings when you are growing up can impact on an individual's later behaviour. For example, if you witness violence as you're growing up, as an adult you may act in the same way by modelling your family's behaviour which you observed.' (Toby)

'I have learnt there is a gene called the warrior gene which some people may have. It is more common in men, although women can have it as well. There is a relationship between having this gene and exhibiting violent and aggressive behaviour.' (Amy)








A special congratulations to all students in the Travel & Tourism department. Know that we are all very proud of your progress and are already excited to see what you will achieve this time next year!






