

Mata/ Maths



Number:

- Show the value of a single digit within a 2 digit number e.g. in $23\ 2 = 2$ tens, 3 = 3 units
- Make sure you know all number facts to 10 off by heart
- Quick recall of number needed to make 10 in a missing number sum e.g. 3 + ____ =
 10
- Apply this knowledge to learn number facts up to 20
- Apply this knowledge to addition and subtraction of bigger numbers
- Add 2 digit numbers vertically, always beginning with the Units (aonaid) and working from the top down. (See maths pack for more details.)
- Subtract 2 digit numbers vertically WITHOUT exchange (carrying).

Shape and Space:

- Revise names of 2D and 3D shapes and their properties (Twinkl has some PowerPoints with this terminology in Irish and are offering free membership for parents during school closures)
- Use 2D shapes to create a repeating pattern (At home you could draw out 3 or 4 shapes on paper then repeat the sequence to create your pattern.)
- Complete pages in packs based on this work.

Activities:

Create shape pictures and talk about their names and properties with your child, look for shapes in your home environment – 2D and 3D and take pictures of the ones they have found, play with 3D shapes e.g. tins, boxes etc and sort them by their properties. Ask questions "Does this shape have straight or curved edges? Does it roll? Does it stack?

Litearthacht/Literacy

Talking and Listening:

- Ask your child to name household objects in Irish let them be the Múinteoir!
- Practice songs and poems we have learned in school every day. Also see 'Music' list for some new ones ©
- Play memory games as a family
 - e.g. Child: I went to the shop and bought milk

Adult: I went to the shop and bought milk and bread

Child: I went to the shop and bought milk, bread and cheese...

(Keep adding to the list in turns to see how many items you can remember!)

- Listen to a story in Irish every day. Ask your child to tell you what happened in the story, who were the characters etc...

- Read stories in English or Irish and talk about what happened. Encourage children to make up new endings to the stories or even act as one of the characters for 'HotSeating' (Rang 3 LOVE doing this in school!)
- Free stories available at https://readon.myon.co.uk/ (Look under 'Genre' for fiction)

Writing:

- Encourage children to use their Dialann Obair Bhaile as a diary. They could write one or two sentences each day about one thing they did and how they feel.
- e.g. Inniu bhí mé ag dathú isteach. Mhothaigh mé sásta.

"In-yoo vee may igg da-hu isschock. Waw-hee may sa-sta"

Today I was colouring in. I felt happy.

- Complete work in packs. Some of the activities have a voice note attached if you copy and paste the link to your browser!
- Encourage children to do small writing activities around the house e.g. writing lists for shopping, writing their full name in Irish until they can spell it, write out the alphabet in their best writing etc...(Message Múinteoir Aisling on Dojo if you need your name translated but it should be on the name card of their folder!)


<u>Teach Your Monster to Read</u> — log on and work through the levels — Múinteoir Aisling can monitor this!
