Early Mathematical Experiences

Understand the value of Numbers: gather everyday objects from around the home or use stickers. Write out some of the numerals between 0-10. Discuss how much each number is worth. Place the corresponding number of objects or stickers beside each numeral. Extend by making a number line 0-10/10-0.

*Have fun making 'mud print birds': see resource card.



Mud Print Bird

You need card, paint, paintbrushes and a stick. Get your hand really muddy and then press it onto the card (fingers slightly open) to make the body of the bird. Paint an eye and beak. Put the stick underneath the bird (we used double sided tape) to make a branch and paint its legs. Decorate the background.
