Development		Use the text from the story as inspiration for an exercise session. Ask children to find a space to
		stand in. Invite them to copy Little Nutbrown Hare's actions:

		Set up a circuit of mini jumps for the children to jump overusing pillows, rolled up blankets, skipping
		ropes, etc.

Can the children talk about who they love and demonstrate how much? While reading the story,

Big Nutbrown Hare? Who do they love (talk about someone you love to give the children ideas)? Ask
them to demonstrate how "big" their love is for these special people just like Little Nutbrown Hare and Big Nutbrown Hare did in the book. Is your love as long as your arms? Is it as high as the sky? Etc.
