REMEMBER OUR SMART RULES FOR ICT

Go through these regularly with your child.

Secret—Always keep your name, address, mobile phone number and password private— it's like giving out the keys to your home!

Meeting—Someone you have contacted in cyberspace can be dangerous. Only do so with your parent's/carer's permission, and only, then when they can be present.

Accepting—emails or opening files from people you don't know or trust can get you into trouble—they may contain viruses or nasty messages.

Remember—someone on-line may be lying and not be who they say they are. Stick to the public areas in chat rooms and if you feel uncomfortable simply get out of there!

Tell—your parent or carer if someone or something makes you feel uncomfortable or worried.
