

Science Week

This year we did multiple experiments. For the first one we were blindfolded and tried wdraw potato and raw apple while pinching our nose. This removed the taste and made it really hard to tell the difference between them and showed us the importance of all of our senses when we're eating. Next we put one egg in water and one in malt vinegar and left them for 24 hours. The egg in water didn't change, but the shell of the egg in the vinegar had dissolved and was now bouncy! This is because vinegar is acidic- the egg shell is similar to our teeth and we now know that we need to be careful with fizzy drinks and juice! For our final experiment of the week we looked at liquid density. We added a variety of liquids to a bowl and they did not mix- they layered on top of each other which showed their different densities. Finally we researched some famous scientists from the past and created mini fact files about them.

Mr Joyce's ASD Class


We have been very busy this term in Mr. Joyce's ASD2 class. We planted vegetables and flowers in the garden and this will hopefully look great in the Spring.
