# Starting School in the Foundation Stage


The 'Foundation Stage', Primary 1 and Primary 2, aims to build on children's pre-school learning experiences. It provides each child with an appropriate learning programme to develop their disposition to learn. It also aims to provide them with the skills and competencies they will need to succeed in school and future life.

The Foundation Stage endorses effective early years practice where teachers have more flexibility in terms of the topics they teach. This flexibility allows teachers to follow the interests of the children, encouraging them to see links in their learning and to appreciate that the skills they learn in one area can be applied elsewhere in their learning.





## Key Stages 1 & 2



Children at Key Stages 1 and 2 build on and develop the experiences provided at the Foundation Stage.

Emphasis continues to be placed on your child's personal, social and emotional development and, of course, on academic achievement through an emphasis on the development of the skills of 'Communication', 'Using Mathematics', 'Using ICT' and 'Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities'.

Children are provided with opportunities to develop these skills through a range of stimulating, challenging, relevant and enjoyable learning experiences across the curriculum.

## Language and Literacy

Literacy is key to learning. In St Ronan's Primary School, Recarson, we focus on developing your child's ability to understand and use language as an integral part of learning.



'Language and Literacy' is taught through the three main areas of talking and listening, reading and writing. Your child's knowledge, skills and understanding are developed within an integrated programme that connects language and literacy work to the broader curriculum.

We strive to ensure that each pupil can express themselves creatively, communicate confidently and interact effectively with the world around them.

## Mathematics and Numeracy

Numeracy is a key life skill, necessary for children to make informed responsible choices and decisions throughout their lives. Here in St Ronan's Recarson, mathematical ideas are developed by making use of practical materials and electronic resources and by exploring various mathematical processes.

Stimulating activities are provided for your child in the areas of 'Number', 'Measures', 'Shape and Space' and 'Handling Data'. Our children also engage in a wide range of purposeful, problem-solving activities which involve them in different modes of mathematical learning, including playing, exploring and investigating, doing and observing, talking and listening, asking questions, reflecting, drafting, reading and recording.



## The World Around Us



We believe that children are innately imaginative and curious and so these dispositions are valued and nurtured in St Ronan's Primary School by providing your child with exciting and relevant contexts for their learning.

At St Ronan's Primary School, Recarson we provide pupils with opportunities to ask questions about themselves and the nature of the world around them. Children learn about how things work and about the characteristics of the natural world, through investigation and discovery.

## The Arts

In St Ronan's PS children's creativity is developed through every area of the curriculum and is closely linked with all aspects of their learning.





Art and Design, Drama and Music - known

as 'The Arts' - provide many opportunities for developing this creativity.

Children are encouraged to express their ideas and feelings in a variety of ways with the aim that their individuality, imagination and creativity develop during their years in primary school.

## Physical Education

The purpose of Physical Education is to provide the opportunity for specific

attention to be given to the physical development, health and well-being of your child.

Pupils in St Ronan's Primary School, Recarson experience a sense of fun, enjoyment and achievement through a variety of progressively challenging activities in P.E. Pupils develop a variety of physical skills and are encouraged to participate in many individual and team sports including Dance, Gymnastics, Athletics, Games and Swimming.



# Personal Development & Mutual Understanding





The development of self-esteem and self-confidence among pupils is very important at St Ronan's. Through a variety of learning experiences and our excellent pastoral support, pupils are encouraged to develop their self—confidence and self-esteem, to think about moral values and to develop their personal and interpersonal skills. 'Personal Development and Mutual Understanding', as a distinct Area of Learning, focuses on encouraging your child to become personally, emotionally and socially effective, to lead a healthy, safe and fulfilled life and to become a confident, independent and responsible citizen.

## Religious Education



We aim to develop the distinctive Catholic ethos of our school, to enrich the spiritual and moral development of your child and to foster links with the Parish of Cappagh. We assist parents in preparing children for the Sacraments of Penance, Eucharist and Confirmation, recognising that parents are key educators of their children - particularly in the areas of faith and religion. Our Grow in Love R.E. Programme reinforces the homeschool link.

We endeavour to develop each child's sense of confidence in his/her own identity and an understanding and respect for other faith traditions.

## Assessing Your Child's Progress

Assessment is an integral part of the learning process. The school monitors your child's progress carefully through a range of assessment techniques and strategies.

As parents, you will be kept fully informed of your child's progress. You will have the opportunity to meet with the Class Teacher during Term 1 and will receive a written Annual Report on your child's progress in:

- Areas of Learning;
- Cross-Curricular Skills;
- Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities.

For children with special needs, a comprehensive programme of class-based teacher support and/or input from external agencies/professionals is available.





## General Information

#### **SCHOOL UNIFORM**

All pupils are expected to adhere to the school rules regarding uniform. Parental co-operation and support is essential in this matter. School uniform consists of:

#### PE UNIFORM

As part of the school's PE policy, pupils are required to change for PE lessons. PE kit is best left in school as the school's 'changing' policy is consistently followed. Your child's teacher will send the Kit home regularly for washing.



School begins at 9.10am, with a 'lining up' bell ringing at 9.05am. As pupils are not insured to be on the school premises before 8.30am in the morning (unless specifically attending the Breakfast Club in the School Canteen), parents are asked to make necessary childcare arrangements as supervision is not in place before this time.

School finishes at 2.00pm for pupils in P1 and P2 and at 3.00pm for pupils in P3-P7. An After School Club operates from 2.00-3.00pm each day for pupils in P1 and P2 - should parents wish to avail of this. A small fee is payable.

As the safety of our pupils is paramount, parents are required to adhere to the <u>one way traffic system</u> which operates at the home collection times of 2.00 and 3.00pm. All cars should approach the school to collect pupils at the gate <u>from the crossroads side</u> (and so may need to pass the school and turn at the crossroads). This system ensures traffic flows smoothly and that children do not have to cross the road. For safety reasons, it is important that parents pass this information on to other family members who routinely collect pupils from our school.

Prompt collection of pupils at 2.00pm and 3.00pm is also very much appreciated as this allows staff to continue with planned school development work/meetings promptly.

#### VISITORS TO THE SCHOOL

All visitors to the school — including parents — are required to report to Reception if needing to pass on a message or to see or collect a child during the school day. This monitoring helps the school maintain Child Protection requirements by knowing who is on the premises at any given time.

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All who work in school appreciate your co-operation with this important matter.

(All visitor protocols are currently adhering to the school's Covid Visitor Policy.)

#### **ATTENDANCE**

Rates of attendance at St Ronan's Primary School, Recarson are very high and contribute greatly to pupils' academic performance. Attendance during the past three school years was: 2017-2018: 98%, 2018-2019: 98%, 2019-2020: 97%.



Where pupils are absent from school for one day or more, parents are asked to send in a short note to the Class Teacher to explain the absence. The date and reason for the absence must be recorded by the Teacher on the attendance sheet and this is also recorded centrally on the school's information management system (SIMS). Assistance in this matter is appreciated as attendance patterns are closely monitored by the school and by the Education Welfare Officer, Education Authority (Western Region).

#### BREAKFAST and BREAKTIME CLUBS

School Canteen staff provide a range of nutritious snacks for pupils who wish to avail of the school's Breakfast Club. This service is available to pupils who wish to purchase breakfast from 8.30am. Fruit juice, hot drinks, cereal, toast, pancakes, scones etc. are available at a subsidised cost and can be purchased daily.

The school also promotes a 'healthy break'. Pupils may bring in healthy snacks\* for break times or avail of the school's Breaktime Club, run by

School Meals staff. Prices for various items, such as fresh fruit or fruit juice, are communicated to parents at the start of each school year and updated when needed.



\*Please support the school's Health Promotion policy by avoiding sending in biscuits, sweets or other sugary snacks or drinks. Please also note, parents should not send in birthday cakes and/or treats to be given out to class members as this is not in keeping with our health promoting school policy. Additionally, a number of pupils in St Ronan's Primary School have a nut allergy and so parents should ensure that all food sent to school is nut free.

#### **SCHOOL MEALS**

A varied and nutritional menu is available to pupils in St Ronan's Recarson PS. Menus are provided and give information on what is on offer. Parents are requested to send in dinner money on a Monday morning if possible or on a daily basis as and when needed. Again, prices are communicated to parents at the start of each school year and updated when needed. (Presently £2.60) Alternatively, pupils may bring a <u>healthy</u> packed lunch. All lunchboxes should be clearly labelled with the child's name and class.

#### AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS

A range of After School Clubs for P3-P7 pupils are available during the course of each school year from 3.00-4.00pm on Mondays, Tuesdays or Wednesdays. These have, in the past, included Drama, Athletics, Computers, Lego Club, Arts and Crafts, Netball, Tennis, and Gaelic Football and Soccer.

#### **SCHOOL CALENDAR OF DATES**

The dates of school terms and holidays for the school year are published and shared with parents at the start of each academic year.



#### **SCHOOL TRIPS**



Pupils have the opportunity to participate in events outside of school. For any external trip, the school must seek written consent from parents for each individual trip. Prompt replies are always appreciated. Parents are often required to contribute towards the cost of school trips.



#### SPECIALIST MUSIC TUITION and TRADITIONAL MUSIC GROUP



The school provides a range of music development opportunities to its pupils. Beyond the delivery of the 'Music' aspect of 'The Arts' curriculum, pupils in P3-P7 also receive Tin Whistle Tuition. Pupils may avail of specialist tuition provided by the Western Region Music Service to learn instruments such as violin, viola and flute. The school's talented Traditional Music Group practises and performs at school events.

#### CHILD PROTECTION and SAFEGUARDING

The school's Safeguarding Team comprises, Mr Patrick Friel (Chair of Governors), Mrs Rose Doyle (Designated Governor for Child Protection), Mrs Meenagh (Principal), Ms Duffy (Designated Teacher for Child Protection) and Mrs McGread (Deputy Designated Teacher for Child Protection)

#### **FIRST AID**

Three members of staff are fully trained to deliver First Aid in the event of an accident or emergency.



#### WHAT HAPPENS WHEN A CHILD FEELS UNWELL IN SCHOOL

Should your child feel or present as unwell in school, the school will contact you to let you know and, if necessary, arrange for collection. It is therefore vitally important that the school has up-to-date contact details for all parents — as well as a contact number in case of Emergency.

It is the policy of our school to make contact with parents should your child receive a bump to the head. It is then left to parents' discretion whether the child stays in school or is taken home.

#### **SCHOOL POLICIES**



The Principal, Teaching Staff and Board of Governors of St Ronan's Primary School, Recarson determine school policies in accordance with the guidance provided by the Department of Education. We have a range of policies and procedures in place which are made available to parents routinely and on request.

#### STAYING INFORMED

At the start of each month, the school issues a Newsletter to keep parents up-to-date with all that is happening in school and to celebrate achievements.

#### CONCERNS AND COMPLAINTS

The school prides itself on close partnership with parents. Should any concern or query arise, parents are encouraged to contact the Class Teacher or Principal at the earliest opportunity so that matters can be discussed, resolved or dealt with.

#### Strong Pastoral Care

St Ronan's Primary School Recarson provides a safe, caring and supportive environment in which all children can flourish.

The behaviour of our children is exemplary - a perfect environment in which to learn. Reflecting the ethos of our school, we place emphasis on positive behaviour and so help children to develop:



- responsibility and self-discipline through our positive behaviour policy;



## RESPECTIVE FUNCTIONS OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS AND PRINCIPAL IN RELATION TO

The Board of Governors of St Ronan's Primary School, Recarson has determined that the following criteria shall be applied, in the event of the number of pupils applying for places in Year 1 being greater than the Admission number, in the order set down below. Priority will be given to children who normally reside in Northern Ireland.

#### **ADMISSIONS CRITERIA - YEAR 1**

During the admissions procedure when applying the criteria <u>punctual applications</u> will be considered before <u>late applications</u> are considered. The application procedure opens on 7 January 2021 at 12 noon (GMT) and an application submitted by the closing date of 29 January 2021 at 12 noon (GMT) will be treated as a punctual application. An application received after 12 noon (GMT) on 29 January 2021 will be treated as a <u>late application</u>.

- Children of compulsory school age who normally reside in the Cappagh Parish.
- Children of compulsory school age who have brothers/sisters, half-brothers/half-sisters presently 2) enrolled in the school.
- Pupils of compulsory school age who normally reside in neighbouring parishes.

If there are more applicants satisfying the last one of the above criteria that can be applied than there are places remaining, then selection will be made on the basis of proximity of parents/guardians home to school, as measured by the shortest route by public thoroughfare, unless there are in the opinion of the Board of Governors, on the basis of appropriate independent evidence supplied, special circumstances (e.g. medical, social or security) applying to a particular application.

#### YEAR 1 ADMISSIONS - AFTER THE BEGINNING OF THE SCHOOL YEAR

If a place becomes available after 1 September 2021 and there are more applicants than places, then the selection of pupils will be made on the application of the Year 1 Admissions Criteria to those pupils seeking admission at the time the place(s) become available.

#### **ADMISSIONS CRITERIA - YEARS 2-7**

The Board of Governors of St Ronan's Primary School, Recarson has determined that the following criteria shall be applied in the order set down below to all pupils seeking admissions to Years 2-7.

- Pupils will be considered for admission provided that the school does not exceed its enrolment number as determined by the Department of Education.
- 2) Children will be considered for admission provided that, in the opinion of the Board of Governors, they would not prejudice the efficient use of school's resources.
- Pupils regarded by the Board of Governors, on the basis of appropriate independent evidence 3) supplied, as having special circumstances, e.g. medical, social or security reasons.

If, at the time of the consideration of the application, there are more eligible applicants than places available, then the Admissions Criteria for entry to Year 1 of pupils of compulsory school age will be applied.

If you have escalated your concern as set out in the above flowchart and are of the view that it has not been addressed satisfactorily, you may revert to the school's complaint policy. This policy should culminate in the option for you to contact the **NI Public Services Ombudsman (NIPSO)** who has the legislative power to investigate your complaint.
