School Self Evaluation (SSE) update

Each year we commit to delivering a variety of endorsed wellbeing programmes which use positive psychology approaches and are designed to explore feelings and to explore individual character strengths while providing opportunities to spot these strengths in ourselves and in others.

To engage in the SSE process we designed a questionnaire to invite the voice and opinion of pupils, staff and parent body of St. Helen's to enable us to improve on how we support the wellbeing of pupils and staff.

Thanks to all who completed these questionnaires. The honest feedback we received has provided us with insight and the opportunity as a whole school staff to reflect on and plan for how we can further work together to prioritise wellbeing in St Helen's Junior School.

Neurodiversity week

In April we celebrated neurodiversity at St Helen's. This coincides with World Autism Month and Autism Awareness Day which takes place every year on April 2nd, a designated United Nations Day of Observance. We are an inclusive school and support differences in all its forms.

Through practical activities, children learnt about our senses, how we communicate in different ways such as our voice, body language and Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) used by some children in our school. Children learnt about how our brains all work differently and the ways we support each other. Children in second class discussed some facts about autism, ADHD, DCD and dyslexia.
