

Please remember to check your child's online activity regularly - many children are using Snapchat, WhatsApp, Tik Tok and Instagram in Primary Schools - the legal age for Snapchat is 13 and for WhatsApp 16. However, we know children are using these platforms to communicate so we have advised them to ensure their accounts are private. As we are

concerned that chat online after school may cause hurt, we have discussed in school how to do so respectfully and how to keep safe online.

Healthy Eating Week

We were delighted to receive funding from Fermanagh and Omagh District Council to offer some additional food provision for all our pupils. We intend to host two Healthy Living Weeks beginning next Monday 26th February with Healthy Breakfast Week. All pupils will be offered a healthy breakfast cereal at snack time free of charge! We will highlight the importance of eating a healthy breakfast and we will encourage the children to try porridge, healthy grains, brown bread, fruit etc. Please note that this will be offered at snack time and your child will need to eat their own breakfast as normal at home prior to coming to school.

The second week of Healthy Living will take place week beginning **Monday 4th March** and will consist of Healthy Snacks. Once again, the children will be offered a range of healthy snacks at snack time free of charge.

During both Healthy Eating Weeks, the children will learn about the importance of healthy eating and healthy food alternatives through assemblies and class activities.

We will also be offering a special St Patrick's Day dinner to all pupils free of charge on Thursday 14th March.
