Engage

- Step 1. If you have this book at home, encourage your child/children to predict what the story is about from the cover. If not use the suggested video link in the Resources box and watch the story together.
- Step 2. Read/watch the story and discuss your child/children's earlier predictions.
- Step 3. Here are some questions to ask your child/children about the story.
 - 1. What did the little girl do when she saw Corduroy?
 - 2. What was missing from Corduroy's clothes?
 - 3. What happened when the nightwatchman discovered Corduroy?
 - 4. Why did Corduroy feel lonely at the start of the story?

Talk about the concept of friendship, what it means to be a friend and the line from the story, 'If you want a friend, be a friend.'

Extend

- Invite your child/children to talk about their favourite teddy or toy and share why their toy is special. Some questions to ask may include asking your child/children when they got their toy, who gave it to them and what makes it special.
- Take photographs of your child/children with their toy and use it to create a book. The book might have photos
 or drawings made by your child/children

For example, I love my my teddy.

Nanny gave me my teddy when I was a baby.

She is so snuggly.

Tina my teddy loves to sleep in my bed

- Suggest creating a toy shop and discuss all the things a shop might need. Make a list of suggested items and encourage your child/children to take an active role in constructing the shop.
- Create a 'Travelling Ted' book who has daily adventures at home, in the backyard, at the park etc.
