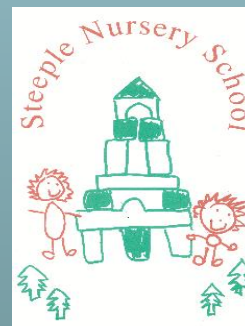

Language development is vitally important to living and learning. We require language to:

- Communicate with others
- Share and express our feelings
- Gain information



Being able to understand and use language allows children to:

- Make their needs and feelings known
- Interact with others
- Self regulate their emotions
- Learn independently and collaboratively

- ❖ Read books



Why is reading so important:

- ❖ Reading is one of the fundamental building blocks of learning
- ❖ Reading is about receiving information
- ❖ It is more than reading from books, it is reading from signs, packaging, magazines, screens
- ❖ It allows children to learn that both print and picture gives us meaning
- ❖ Children learn that reading gives pleasure



The benefits of reading and sharing books frequently with your child:

- ❖ Bonding time, family time
- ❖ Sharing experiences
- ❖ Enjoyment and fun
- ❖ Develops listening and attention skills
- ❖ Models good language & vocabulary
- ❖ Extends your child's vocabulary
- ❖ Enhances imagination
- ❖ Extends general knowledge
- ❖ Raises confidence
- ❖ Develops social skills



When reading aloud to your child the following strategies are employed:

- ❖ *Physical handling of the book*
- ❖ *Eye contact*
- ❖ *Vocal expression*
- ❖ *Facial expression*
- ❖ *Sound effects*
- ❖ *Questioning*
- ❖ *Actions*
- ❖ *Voice and tone*
- ❖ *Prediction*



Tips for reading with your child:



- *Create the right environment for reading*
- *Choose a quiet time when you have less chance of being distracted*
- *Have a routine of a story at bed time*
- *Choose a book together*
- *Talk about the front cover with your child*
- *Read your child's favourite book many times*
- *Have lots of reading material in your house*
- *Visit your local library*
