The fastest rate of development is in the first 7 years

- One third of the adult vocabulary is formed by the age of 6
- One third of the adult brain is formed by the age of 4
- The child's personality has been developed by the age of 4
 - Between the age of 1-4 a child's IQ has developed as much as in the next 16 years

Supporting Young Children To Engage With Risk and Challenge

- Physical Risks-learning to negotiate natural hazards
- Developing skills in negotiating the physical environment
- Learning how to use tools and equipment safely and purposefully
- Developing control and coordination of their bodies

- Developing reasoning skills/solving problems
- Trying out new ideas and willing to "have a go"
- Being resourceful, inventive and creative











Positive Behaviour

We want to ensure every child enjoys their time in Nursery School so we work hard to promote a positive attitude to behaviour by-

- Promoting respect for each other
- Ensure adequate supervision
- Encourage/ reward positive behaviour
- Making sure resources are well managed
- Through discussions with children they are made aware of what is acceptable behaviour
- Children are encouraged to express their emotions and to resolve conflict
- All staff will deal with unacceptable behaviour in a consistent way
- Following up any complaint made by a pupil/ parent about bullying and report back
- Parents will fill in a form to say they agree with procedures





Ways You Can Help Us

- Help child understand they come everyday
- Send child with adult inform school if any changes
- NO CHILD WILL BE ALLOWED TO GO HOME WITH ANY PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF 16
- Shut doors and gates firmly
- School begins at 9.00am and 12.30pm
- Please don't come too early/must be in school by 9.10am or 12.40pm
- Be prompt : collection 11.20-11.30am or 2.50-3.00pm
- Use our assigned car park or parking spaces along side of road.
- Regular attendance security
- Tell school if child is ill/head lice/impetigo etc.
- Get involved VOLUNTEER
- Check Seesaw App regularly
- Take home belongings



Ways You Can Help Your Child

- Talk positively about Nursery
- Encourage independence taking on/off coat; hanging up coat; looking after own belongings
- Read stories / rhymes (Library : mid Sept Story/Sacks-2nd term)
- Check seesaw App regularly this is our main method of communication
- Read notices, letters, attend meetings get involved
- Pre-writing use lower case letter

eg. Peter not PETER

- Don't send sick child to school
- Encourage good eating habits / get lots of sleep
- Value and praise your child's work
- Remember you are the most important person in their lives!
