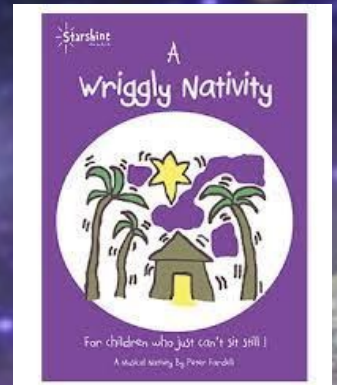


Children will continue to go to the hall to do fun activities. We have been busy doing balancing skills and fun games with Ronan.
