- Classes for next year: Information regarding classes will be sent out with the end of year report.
- Cash for Clobber Reminder: At LPS we have registered for the 'Cash for Clobber' scheme run by Cookstown Textiles in conjunction with Eco Schools NI. The programme aims to teach school children the environmental and social benefits of recycling while helping those less fortunate and raising significant valuable funds for the school. The school gets 40p for every Kilogram and at the end of the school year, the organisation with the most 'clobber' wins an extra £1500. If you have any old clothes, bedding, curtains, shoes or handbags, you can put them into either one of the 50 'Cash for Clobber' bags available via the office, or alternatively you can put them in a sturdy bin bag. Please leave items into school at your own convenience and we will arrange for them to collected. Please note, no duvets, pillows or soiled items should be included. Thank you in advance!

Due to the many pressures on family resources the number of free school meals has risen not only in Loanends but in other local schools as well. We would encourage parents to make use of these. The criteria for **Free School Meals** are as follows:

- 1. The parent/guardian is in receipt of Income/Income Related Employment and Support Allowance/Income based Jobseeker's Allowance or if a pupil claims Income Support in their own name.
- 2. The parent/guardian is in receipt of the guarantee element of Pension Credit.
- 3. The parent receives Child Tax Credit/Working Tax Credit and has an annual taxable income of less than £16,190.
- 4. He/she has a statement of educational needs and is designated to require a special diet.
- 5. Universal credit and have net household earnings not exceeding £14,000 per year.
- 6. He/she is a child of an Asylum Seeker supported by the Home Office Asylum Support Assessment Team (ASAT).
- **Uniform Allowance-Primary/Special School Pupils:-** A pupil in full time education shall be entitled to a uniform allowance where the entitlement criterion is met at points 1, 2, 3 or 6.
- Please note that school will recommence on WEDNESDAY 28 AUGUST: This is a full school day for P2-P7. P3 will finish at 2pm and follow the normal pattern of 3:00pm finish (Wednesday to Friday). From 2 September, the pattern for P3 is:
 - Monday and Tuesday 3.00pm
 - Wednesday Friday 2.00pm

Please note the following with regard to the last week in August/start of the new term:

- There will be no school bus available until Monday 2 September. Parents will need to make their own arrangements to transport children to and from school from Wednesday 28 to Friday 30 August.
- All pupils will require a break since there won't be Healthy Break available until Monday 2 September.
- A packed lunch for everyone is required for three days: Wednesday 28 to Friday 30 August; school meals will be available from Monday 2 September.
- School milk will be available from Monday 9 September. More information to follow in the September Update.
- Milk, dinners and healthy break should be ordered on the SchoolMoney App. Please order in advance and ensure prompt payment.

- Arrival and Collection Times: There is a "window" of 15 minutes for children to arrive to school in the morning. Class teaching will begin at 9:00am. Time keeping for a some pupils hasn't been great at both ends of the day, usually the same egroup of pupils. The side gates are locked at 9:00am; therefore all children should be in class by this time since lateness causes disruption and means that children don't get the best start to the day. I also would be grateful if parents could please ensure pupils are collected at the appropriate time in the afternoons. Teachers and Classroom Assistants have other duties at the end of the day. Supervising pupils has a knock on effect. Please make every effort to keep to the times.
- Morning Club: This will also continue. Supervision will be in place in the Assembly Hall form 8:30am and payment of £1.25 per day can be made in advance by SchoolMoney. It is important that a space is booked in advance to ensure the appropriate level of supervision.
- **Thank you** to all parents who helped out this year with PTAFA events, trips, transport, tree planting, Health Promotion Week and after school activities etc.

As ever, your time, talent, loyalty and commitment have been very much appreciated and contributes to all that we offer our pupils. We would love to have more parents willing to help out, particularly with PTAFA, as on the ground support falls to a very small group of people and means it is difficult to man events. Any parent who would like to volunteer to help out with the PTAFA, school events or activities must have the appropriate checks completed. If you would like to be included from September on our list, please speak to me.

A special thank you to Sophia Robb (P4) who once again raised money for school funds through the sale of sunflowers. A total of £160 was collected. Thank you! You are brilliant!
