Personal, Social and Emotional Development

*Talk to your child about the wide range of emotions we can feel. Give scenarios and discuss. E.g. How do you feel when it is your birthday? How do you feel when you fall and cut your knee?

Physical Development

*Threading activities help to strengthen the small muscles in children's hands. Ask your child to make a necklace using the materials from their Home Learning Pack. They could use the coloured spools and lace or work on their fine motor skills by clicking the links together to make a necklace.
