Chalk an egg shape on the floor outside and fill it with natural objects, such as flowers, sticks and leaves.

Design a new outfit for the Easter Bunny.

What do you think the Easter Bunny would like to wear? Make sure you include lots of pockets to keep Easter eggs in and an Easter bonnet for his head!



Easter Challenge Cards

Design an Easter egg with repeating patterns on it.

You might like to use colours, shapes or objects to create your repeating pattern. You could use paint, chalk or crayons.

Make an Easter garden.

Fill an old plant pot or container with soil. You can create your garden by using small stones to make

pathways, some grass or moss and some flower petals. You could also include some small world animals, such as chicks, rabbits and lambs.



Easter Challenge Cards

Create your own Easter Bunny adventure story.

Can you think of your own story about an adventure the Easter Bunny had? Maybe he lost the eggs or forgot his map! You could ask an adult to write your story down for you and add pictures yourself.

Taste hot cross buns.

You might like to toast one and eat one cold. Which do you prefer? Do you like butter on your hot cross bun? Do your friends and family like to eat them?
