Vanessa LoBue, Assistant Professor of Psychology, Rutgers University Newark (2016) Face time: here's how infants learn from facial expressions Decades of research from many different labs suggest that faces are quite special for infants right from birth. Researchers still aren't sure how infants learn about faces so quickly. Some argue that infants have a biological predisposition to prefer faces right from birth. Others suggest that the massive amount of experience newborns get with faces right away is enough to promote rapid learning.
