Nursery Education At Omagh North Nursery School

Starting nursery school at 3 years of age is very exciting and we aim to make it a memorable and enriching experience. At Omagh North Nursery School, staff recognise and value the range of home experiences that children come from. We want to build on these experiences and support your child to be as independent as they can be, which will help to develop a wealth of age-appropriate skills.

Omagh North Nursery School is the only principal led purpose-built nursery school in Omagh. As a principal led nursery school, all of the principal's time and effort goes solely into the education of pre-school children, ensuring that they 'learn, grow and strive to be the best they can be!'

It is situated on a very bright, spacious, and welcoming site on the Old Mountfield Road, which received enhancement during 2020.

We delight in welcoming children not only from inside our town boundary but from many outlying townlands and villages. This affords us the opportunity to integrate children from urban and rural areas together and to learn from, with and about each other.

As a community nursery school, we also delight in integrating children from all religious and cultural backgrounds and believe that inclusion and diversity are important elements of today's society. Inclusion and diversity is an integral part of our curriculum, effectively delivered through our Media Initiative Project.

Omagh North Nursery School's qualified and experienced staff consist of three teachers, two full-time nursery assistants, four part-time assistants, a secretary, a dining attendant, a cleaner and a building supervisor. Our team's aim is to promote the education of our children in all aspects of their development and work closely with parents and other agencies in order to enable all children 'to be the best they can be'.

At all times the staff of Omagh North Nursery School strive to provide a warm, welcoming and caring atmosphere where everyone feels valued, and the needs of the child are at the centre of all our decision making.

Omagh North Nursery will be hosting an Open Day on Friday 10th January between 12 noon and 2pm.

OUR LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

Our learning environment is bright and welcoming filled with age appropriate resources and open-ended play materials which will provide stimulation and encourage creative thinking.

Our indoor environment provides children with opportunities to engage in imaginative play, messy play, sensory play. Children are encouraged to develop sharing and turn taking skills at a wide variety of other activities such as construction play, table top activities, jigsaw puzzles, playdough activities etc. Children also develop fine motor skills by engaging in activities at the finger gym, the writing centre, the messy table and the painting easel.

Our outdoor environment is fortunate to have a soft pore safety surface throughout the entire area. Fixed pieces of equipment are fused with an array of natural materials to encourage creativity and imagination. We also offer many additional resources to develop physical skills outdoors.

We have a covered sandhouse, an outdoor cottage, a wooden ship, a range of digging areas filled with a variety of materials, open ended small world areas, an outdoor play kitchen, raised beds and a STEM yard, along with the other expected items of play.

Children go outside every day and experience the outdoor learning environment in all weathers, thoroughly enjoying being outdoors through all seasons.

THE PRESCHOOL CURRICULUM

Omagh North Nursery provides your child with a range of stimulating experiences which will encourage your child to develop their confidence and self-esteem in a warm, caring environment.

We will plan the experiences in line with the Department of Education for Northern Ireland's Curricular Guidance for Pre-school Education. Your child's experiences and learning will be planned for using 6 curricular areas

- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Physical Development and Movement
- Language Development
- Early Mathematical Experiences
- The World Around Us
- The Arts



Your child's development will be closely recorded and monitored using observations and assessments and staff will use this information to plan for your child's further development. Any challenges your child experiences will receive support and encouragement from all the staff to ensure that every child reaches their maximum potential during their pre-school year.

The school aims to build upon the learning experiences which have already taken place from birth to pre-school age and value the partnership between school and home immensely. Learning is based on play, practical activities and the interests of the individual child.

The children's experiences include indoor and outdoor play, art and craft, music and movement, imaginative play, construction activities, gardening and care of the living environment, stories and conversation, snack and meal times. Regular educational outings are planned to add to the value of the children's experiences.

We intend to increase the children's level of involvement in their play and concentrate on addressing their well-being throughout the year, believing that happy, confident children are active learners.

During your child's preschool year at Omagh North Nursery School they will get to experience:

- A nursery staffed by highly experienced teachers and assistants
- A dedicated teaching Special Educational Needs Coordinator (SENCo)
- Circle time activities led by a highly experienced language and communication support assistant
- A range of healthy snacks and the promotion of independence to help your child prepare a snack

- Access to a forest and local parks to learn about nature first hand
- Trips out into the community such as Dunnes, Library, Post Office, etc
- An appreciation of inclusion and respect through the Media Initiative Project which is led by Mrs McGovern
- Regular coaches who develop fundamental movement, balanceability, physical literacy and the arts
- Feis and Omagh Show participation
- A live theatrical experience offered by the Banyan Theatre
- An amazing sing along with Tom Sweeney
- Participation in Christmas and End of Year Shows
- Intergenerational work with a local nursing home



PARTNERSHIP WITH PARENTS

As the first educator of your child, we see the partnership between parents/ carers and staff as essential to the success of a child's pre-school year. We involve parents closely in their child's development and keep them updated with our Newsletters and curriculum information documents. We successfully bid for Getting Ready to Learn funding and offer a range of parent workshops to ensure school readiness at the end of your child's nursery year. Parents are also invited to share any skills or particular interests they have with us in order to enhance the children's nursery experiences.

You will also have the opportunity to meet with the school Health Visitor, Kerry O'Hanlon. During this appointment, which takes place in school during Term 1, Kerry will be able to assess your child's 3+ health development and well-being. It also provides you with the opportunity to discuss any other concerns you may have.

We understand how important it is that you know what your child is learning in school, and we send home a Curriculum Information Newsletter at the beginning of each planning period. This provides you with information on how to support your child's vocabulary, skills and development at home.



PLAY TOGETHER, LEARN TOGETHER

As part of our transition program for our preschool children, Mrs McGovern and Mrs Broderick offer a 'Play Together, Learn Together' program.

This is an opportunity for children who are joining Omagh North Nursery School, to become familiar with their new environment, supported by their parent/carer.

Through this program, children and their parent/carer are invited in for three successive afternoon sessions in May/June, during which your child will experience a typical day in nursery, albeit in a much shorter session.

At the end of each session, staff will provide you with a range of resources to support the focus of the Play Together, Learn Together session.

GETTING READY TO LEARN

The Getting Ready to Learn project affords us the opportunity to offer parents and children:

- Education Works Workshops and borrowing packs
- Big Bedtime Read Workshops and book borrowing packs
- Ages & Stages Workshops
- Happy, Healthy Kids Workshops and resources to borrow



HOME / SCHOOL CONTACT

All staff actively encourage parental contact with the school. The parents' support is essential in working with the school for the child's benefit. Parents and children starting school are invited to attend the school's transition programmes. These are run so that the children may become familiar with the school, and so that new parents can be shown ways to become involved in their child's education. The school will keep parents regularly updated regarding events and ways you can support your child's learning using Curriculum Newsletter and our School's NI app.

We like to foster parental relationships in various ways such as invitations to meetings, assistance with developing areas of the school, fundraising as well as informal contacts at the beginning and end of the school day. Parents are encouraged to discuss any matters of concern in the first instance with the class teacher. However, it may be best to make an appointment outside teaching time if a lengthy discussion is necessary. Parent Teacher Meetings are held during Term 1 each year, with follow up meetings when required and a final written report is provided to parents at the end of their child's nursery year.

Parents of children who have Individual Education Plans will be contacted by the class teacher on a regular basis to discuss the content of the plan and the progress of the child.

OTHER FUNDING

We have also been fortunate enough during 2024-25 to benefit from funding from Radius Housing. This afforded us the opportunity to create a garden, which enables us to participate in intergenerational work with a local nursing home.

PASTORAL CARE

The staff are committed to the wellbeing of their pupils. Our policy is to care for the children and support their development regarding their physical health and safety together with their emotional stability. Partnership between staff, parents and other professionals is important in this area.

We have a Child Protection Policy in place to safeguard our children and the designated teacher is Mrs Butler with the deputy designated teachers being Mrs Duffy-Phillips and Mrs McGovern. Our Board of Governors also has a member responsible for Child Protection and that is Mr Johnston.

We are also members of the Operation Encompass Project. The Nursery School will be notified if any of our children have been involved in a domestic violence incident.

CHILD PROTECTION PROCEDURE

1. Staff have a duty of care to report cases of unusual behaviour, unusual marking, severe neglect or repeated physical or verbal aggression to the designated teacher, Mrs Butler.
2. Staff record the incident factually.

It may be necessary for the Designated Teacher to report incidents to or to seek advice from the EA Western Region CPSS Designated Officer or relevant external agency.

Parents will be provided with a summary of our policy regarding Child Protection prior to children commencing with us.

PROMOTION OF GOOD BEHAVIOUR

We recognise that pre-school children are going through the developmental stage of achieving self-control and a fuller awareness of others.

Good behaviour can be promoted by parents and staff working together to develop children's social and communication skills, helping them to explore their feelings in an acceptable manner.

We believe that adults are role models for our children therefore both good parenting and effective teaching relationships can prevent children's social, emotional and behavioural difficulties. Our policy is available and will be explained to parents. We also explain how we intend to promote an anti-bullying culture.

In all classes we use positive statements through our Golden Rules to encourage the promotion of positive behaviour. Our Golden Rules are:

- We use walking feet
- We share and take turns
- We are honest
- We are gentle with our toys
- We listen
- We have kind hands and feet



PUPIL WELFARE AND SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

To provide our children with the best possibility of achieving their maximum potential, regular attendance at Omagh North Nursery School is essential.

Miss School - Miss Out!!

Our Getting Ready to Learn 'Big Bedtime Read' program will provide you with hints and tips to establish firm bedtime routines, to ensure that children are well prepared for their nursery experiences the following day.

ABSENCES

If your child is absent from school for any reason, you should inform school by telephone or e-mail, explaining the absence and estimating the date of your child's return to school.

Long-term absences should have a Doctor's certificate. Parents who wish to take their children away during school hours should contact the school office. These absences should only be for important reasons when no other arrangements can be made.

Please be aware that school and the Department of Education does not support the practice of children being taken on holidays during the school term. Average pupil attendance at Omagh North Nursery School is 87%.

CHARGING AND REMISSION POLICY

As we are funded by the Department of Education there is no daily charge to parents for the Nursery Education their child receives. However, we ask for a contribution (currently £100 for the year, payable termly) towards items such as a daily snack, cookery ingredients, extra equipment, parties, entertainment, and their school trips. It is also used to bring visiting puppet shows, musicians and curriculum enriching experiences to our school.

MEALS

Hot meals are provided for all children in the full time class. Omagh North Nursery's meals are provided by Gibson Meals Kitchen and we have a wide variety of meals, in accordance with the new healthy school meals legislation.

Specific food allergies are also catered for by Gibson's kitchen staff. Currently meals cost £2.50 per day/£12.50 per week which is payable by cash on Monday of each week.

Boys and girls uniforms consist of:

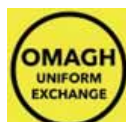

CURRICULUM COMPLAINTS PROCEDURE

Should you have any questions or complaints about the school, child safety or the curriculum, you should make direct contact with the school. Usually, discussion with the class teacher, can resolve most issues quite easily.

Following discussion with the class teacher, you may still wish to write to the Principal, this is Stage 1 of the Complaints Procedure.

If your complaint is about the Principal, or is unresolved after Stage 1, please write to the chairperson of the Board of Governors.

If you are not satisfied with the response after Stage 2, refer the matter to the Northern Ireland Public Service Ombudsman.

All school policies, both pastoral and curriculum, are available upon request.



ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

A Selection Advisory Committee consisting of the Principal and three Governors, subject to the final approval of the Board of Governors, will apply the Admissions Criteria.

It is a standard requirement to provide an original Birth Certificate in order to verify the age of the child and two proofs of address for the adult making the application. These will be uploaded onto the EA portal at the time of application.

Children who are not normally resident in Northern Ireland will not be considered for places until all children who live in Northern Ireland have been considered. The Board of Governors have determined that, in the event of there being more applicants than places available the following criteria will be applied, in the order set down, to select children for the available places:

Please be reminded that we offer 52 full-time places for pre-school children and to date we have never refused any applicants.

Admissions Criteria

A timetable of pre-school admissions procedures setting out the dates by which an application is to be submitted is available at www.eani.org.uk/admissions under 'Pre-School Admissions'. During the admissions procedure when applying the criteria punctual applications will be considered before late applications are considered.

The application procedure opens on Friday 10 January 2025 at 12noon (GMT) and an application submitted by the closing date Friday 24 January 2025 at 12noon (GMT) will be treated as a punctual application. An application received after 12noon (GMT) on 24 January 2025 will be treated as a late application.

As the pre-school admissions procedure is in two stages the timetable also specifies the relevant dates at Stage 2 which will determine if an application is to be considered as punctual or late.

Statutory Criteria

1. Children from socially disadvantaged circumstances in their final pre-school year who were born:
 - on or between 2 July 2021 and 1 July 2022 (inclusive) and whose parents have not exercised their right to defer their child's entry to primary school; or,
 - on or between 1 April 2021 and 1 July 2021 (inclusive) or were due to be born on or between those dates but were born earlier; and,
 - have not attended or are not currently attending a funded pre-school setting under the Pre-School Education Programme as a target aged child; and,
 - that child's parent has completed a request to defer their child starting P1 until September 2026.

Note: Children from 'socially disadvantaged circumstances' means a child whose parent has an entitlement to (i) Income Support, or (ii) Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, or (iii) Income related Employment and Support Allowance, or (iv) Universal Credit. When parents apply for places for their child on this basis they must provide Benefit Verification to confirm that they have an entitlement. The application procedure for Pre-School will outline how Benefit Verification can be submitted.

2. Children not from socially disadvantaged circumstances (as defined above) who are in their final pre-school year (as defined by Criterion 1).

Sub-Criteria

If there are more pupils satisfying the last criterion which can be applied, (ie 1 – 2), then selection for the remaining places will be on the basis of the following sub-criteria, as applied in the order set down below:

- a. Those families who choose Omagh North Nursery School as their first preference.
- b. Eldest/only child of the family or children who have had a brother(s)/sister(s), half-brother(s)/half-sister(s), step- brother(s)/step-sister(s), fostered/adopted brother(s)/sister(s) who are **currently attending** Omagh North Nursery – please include name of child and class.
- c. Eldest/only child of the family or children who have had a brother(s)/sister(s), half-brother(s)/half-sister(s), step- brother(s)/step-sister(s), fostered/adopted brother(s)/sister(s) who **previously attended** Omagh North Nursery – please include name of child, year attended and class
- d. Children whose family member is currently a member of the school's staff or governing body (parent/guardian/grandparent).
- e. All other children.

In the event of over-subscription in the last sub-criterion applied then selection for all remaining places will be on the basis of the initial letter of the surname as per the birth certificate in the order set out below:-

T, J, Z, O, W, X, Mac, S, N, B, P, R, Q, I, A, C, F, G, Mc, E, U, L, V, Y, H, D, K, M

The order was determined by a randomised selection of letters carried out by the governors of the school at a meeting on 8th October 2024. In the event of surnames beginning with the same letter the subsequent letters of the surnames will be used in alphabetical order. In the event of 2 identical surnames the alphabetical order of the initials of the forenames will be used as per the birth certificate.

Non-statutory criteria

Note: Applications falling under Criterion 3 are processed only during Stage 2 of the admissions process, after final pre- school year (Statutory 1 and 2) applications.

3. Children who were born:

- on or between 1 April 2021 - 1 July 2021 (inclusive), or were due to be born on or between those dates but were born earlier; and,
 - have attended or are currently attending a funded pre-school setting under the Pre-School Education Programme as a target aged (not penultimate aged) child; and,
 - that child's parent has completed a request to defer their child starting P1, or
- on or between 2 July 2022 and 1 July 2023 (inclusive); or
- on or between 1 April 2022 and 1 July 2022 (inclusive) or were due to be born on or between those dates but were born earlier; and that child's parent has completed a request to defer their child starting P1 until September 2027.

Tie Breaker – Non Statutory Criterion 3

Children within Criterion 3 will be selected in Chronological Order of Age – eldest child first. In the event of two or more children having the same DOB the above random selection of letters will be used.

Supporting Information

It is important that parent(s)/guardian(s) when submitting the application, give all relevant supporting information and written evidence, which may be needed including the child's birth certificate and 2 proofs of address at the time of application.

All supporting information **MUST** be provided by **4pm on Wednesday 29th January 2025**.

IF PARENTS HAVE ANY DIFFICULTY IN COMPLETING THEIR APPLICATION THEY SHOULD CONSULT THE PRINCIPAL OF THE SCHOOL.

Duty to Verify

The Board of Governors reserves the right to require such supplementary evidence as it may determine, to support or verify information on any applicant's Application.

If the requested evidence is not provided to the Board of Governors by the deadline given this will result in the withdrawal of an offer of a place. Similarly, if information is supplied which appears to be false or misleading in any material way, the offer of a place will be withdrawn.

Waiting List Policy

Selection for any vacant place that may arise will be made by applying the above criteria, sub-criteria and tie-breaker if required, to children in their final pre-school year.

Penultimate children on our waiting list will only be offered a place in strict chronological order of age.



WHAT'S NEXT

What age can I apply to nursery at?

If your child is 3 years old on or before 1st July 2025, you can apply for a preschool full time place when the portal opens on 10th January 2025.

What if my child is not 3 years old until after 1st July 2025?

You can still make an application through the EANI portal, however, as Omagh North Nursery School only has 52 full time places now and **NO** part time places, your child may not get a place with us. Please make sure to put plenty of other preferences on your form.

What do I do next?

You will need to create an account on the EANI website admission's portal. Once 12 noon comes on Friday 10th January, you can apply for a full time place at Omagh North Nursery School.

When you begin your application be sure to select **OMAGH NORTH NURSERY SCHOOL** as your first preference. You will then be asked to give reasons for your application choice and we would advise you to read the criteria and list in order which criteria your child fits into.

Do I need to do anything after I submit my application?

If you have not already uploaded your child's birth certificate and any supporting documentation, you **MUST** do this by 4pm on Wednesday 29th January.

When will I hear the outcome of my application?

If your child is a preschool child (they turn 3 years by 1st July 2025) you will hear the outcome of your application on Wednesday 9th April 2025.

Does my child have a good chance of getting into Omagh North Nursery School?

In the history of the school, we have **never turned anyone away** who selected Omagh North Nursery School as their **1st preference**.

This year as we have only 52 full time places, it is even more important to select Omagh North Nursery School as your first preference to give your child the best possible chance of getting a place with us.

Do you have any Open Days or Taster Sessions?

Yes we have an Open Day on Friday 10th January between 12 noon and 2 pm. Please contact the office on 02882 246431 to book in. We also offer Taster Sessions in February and March for those who did not attend in November and December Sessions. Mrs McGovern will contact you via e-mail to invite you into these sessions.
