





Tips for Parents

Establish a routine for homework with your child. The best time is after a short break when your child returns from school: get it out of the way early and leave the rest of the evening free.

Agree with your child that TV, playing sport, Youth Club, phone-calls etc., will only be allowed after homework is completed.

Encourage your child to unpack and pack his/ her bag in an organised way.

Sign your child's homework.

Encourage your child to record homework carefully. Pupils will not always remember what is said in class and should write it down clearly in their planner.
