Thank you to everyone for your support during this settling in time.

All of your children have now settled happily into the routines in Castlereagh Nursery School. The staff are enjoying getting to know all the children and our new families. Many have made new friends and are growing in confidence each day. Now that they have all settled well, we would ask that you ensure in the morning that you hand your child over to a member of staff at the door of each room.

Very soon the majority of the children will be staying for dinner, they are excited about this part of the nursery day and have settled well into the new routine.

We have a very busy month ahead with lots of exciting learning opportunities for your child. Please help us by talking about these activities at home.

We have a very busy time before Christmas so please read the information in the newsletter carefully. We always have a handy dairy dates page at the end as an overview of the months ahead to help you plan events into already busy family life.

REMINDERS

Please do not park in the carpark outside the nursery, this is for staff cars only.

Please send your children into school in **shoes with no laces** (Velcro is best), we are encouraging your child to become independent and laces can be very tricky for small fingers. If your child is ill, please either e-mail the nursery or ring the office to let their teacher know.

Dinner money is payable on a **SUNDAY EVENING** or **MONDAY** morning via the **SCHOOL MONEY APP**

The snack/school enrichment fund money is now due for October - from 2nd October to 27th October

£3.50 per week x 4 weeks = Total £14 for school fund.

£12.50 per week for dinners.

If your child is sick and the school has been notified before 10am when the dinner numbers have been sent through then dinner will not need to be paid for that day.

Your account can be topped up at any time and Shelley (secretary) will deduct each day's dinner when they attend.

As you will be able to see from the diary dates at the end of this newsletter, we provide lots of different visitors into the nursery, Sonal Sports, Mr Hullabaloo, Debbie Dolittle etc. These visitors are paid for from the snack/enrichment fund. Without the parents' contributions we would not be able to provide these experiences for your children. Thank you so much for supporting the nursery in this way.

Parent/Teacher Consultations

We will be holding our Settling in meetings on Monday 23rd October (Mrs Jones' Class) and Tuesday 24th October (Mrs Morrow's Class). These will last for 10 minutes and the teachers will share your child's settling in profile and also photographs of what they have been doing during their first 6-8 weeks of school. Interview sheets will be placed outside each classroom on Monday 9th October. Please choose the timeslot that suits you best.



Welly Walk

On Thursday 16th November we will be embarking on our main fundraising event of the year - Our Welly Walk!!! This is a very exciting day for our children as we have lots of fun outdoor activities planned. Altogether the children can walk the whole way around the perimeter of the nursery 4 or maybe even 5 times!!! In the past our parents have been very generous with their sponsorship of this event and to all those past parents we thank you.

Over the past couple of years we have been able to purchase 2 new reading Wig-Wams for the outdoor garden, and Ipads for the children to record their own learning.

This year we would like to further enhance our outdoor areas, developing more areas for the children to use. We may need some help throughout the year from willing parents/grandparents to paint/dig/weed some areas. We will keep you updated as to when these events will be happening.

Stay and Play Sessions

You are invited to stay and play with your child and decorate a clay Halloween decoration. These are small items, the pumpkins hold a tea light as do the bats and the cauldrons are quite small, but big enough to hold 3-4 'celebration/heros' sized sweets.

Themes for October Nursery Rhymes and Autumn

We will be spending time this month learning lots of familiar and perhaps new nursery rhymes. Research has shown that the ability to use rhyming words i.e in nursery rhymes at an early age has a significant influence in future reading success. You will be sent home a laminated nursery rhyme sheet, this is yours to keep, please sing these at home with your child. We will also send home a Nursery Rhyme quiz for parents, it's just for fun so please test your knowledge and don't just 'Google it'. Send completed entries back into nursery by Friday 21st October and a winner will be picked at random.

Curriculum Evening

We are holding our annual Curriculum evening on Thursday 19th October 6.30pm - 7.15pm. This is a fun and interactive evening for parents to attend. It is especially useful for parents who have their first child is attending Castlereagh Nursery School. It will also give you an insight into a day in Nursery, also what and how your child learns through play.

We would love to see you there.

Autumn is such an exciting sensory time of year for us all. Please take your child for walks in the park and discuss what they can hear, smell, touch and see. We would be delighted if you could bring into nursery some of the interesting

things you find. A bag will be sent home next week for you to collect some Autumnal 'treasures'.

We will be talking to the children about the changes that are happening all around them, changes in the weather, nights getting darker, leaves changing colours and falling off the trees. Most importantly, how to stay safe at Halloween.

We would like to extend a warm welcome to one of our students Jodie Rainey - She is studying Early Childhood Studies at Stranmillis and will be in nursery on a Monday and Tuesday.

Things you can help with at home with your child in October.

Go for a walk - Discuss the textures, shapes, sizes of what you find. Look up the names for things you are unsure of together.

Encourage your child to take off and put on their own coat/shoes/hat/gloves

Encourage your child to brush their own teeth (under supervision) this will help when we begin our tooth brushing routine.




Please see the dates for your diary sheet to stay up to date with weekly coloured objects.

School Lending Library

Focus Children

We will begin our focus children next week. This is where we observe 3 children really closely in all 6 areas of the curriculum and send all these observations home via parent share on the Evidence Me app. The Friday before your child is one of the focus children you will be given a sheet for you to record up to 4 recent experiences. These can be anything from a visit to the park, or an ice cream shop or a family member coming to visit. You can upload photographs of these experiences onto the evidence me app. If you have any questions at all about how to do this, please speak to your child's teacher.

Scrap Books

Your child's scrap book is available in the hall. Each class has their own black folder at the classroom door. Staff will place any pictures your child has requested to 'keep for their scrapbook'. Each child has their own section in the black folder. Please check this regularly when you get a chance and stick them into their scrap book. Staff will aim to keep at least 1 piece of art work per month. Feel free to add any other masterpieces they bring home. Even certificates from gymnastic competitions etc can be placed in the scrap book. This is a place to keep everything as a record of your child's year in nursery.
