Senior Room Laptops: Our school laptop scheme will continue next year. Laptops will be purchased for pupils moving into  $3^{rd}$  class in the Senior Room. The cost of the laptop is €525. Parents can pay the €262.50 at the beginning of the school year or in two instalments throughout the school year – October and February.
