#### 1. Introduction

This document records the outcomes of our current digital learning plan, including targets and the actions we will implement to meet the targets.

#### 1.1 School Details:

Scoil Náisiúnta an Chroí Ró-Naofa is a Catholic, co-educational primary school located in Rath, Ballybrttas, Co. Laois. At present we are an eight mainstream classroom school with two special classes for children with autism. We currently have 215 pupils and our staff includes the principal, 8 mainstream classroom teachers, 2 special class teachers, 4 special education teachers, 10 SNAs and a school

#### 1.2 School Vision:

Our Catholic school is a place where the children will feel safe, happy and respected. We aim to provide them with a rich, broad and varied learning experience so that all children enjoy success and come to realise their own and other's uniqueness and talents. We at Digital Learning to enhance learning across all subject areas. We seek to provide the children with opportunities to develop lifelong Rath N.S. endeavour to integrate Digital Learning in a meaningful way in line with these values. We aim to explore the potential of learning skills that will support their learning as they move through primary and into secondary education

# 1.3 Brief account of the use of digital technologies in the school to date:

- We use technology in line with available ICT infrastructure
- Every mainstream classroom is equipped with an Interactive Whiteboard and a teacher's laptop with internet access
- A networked photocopier is located in the main office.
- We have four SEN rooms, all of which have interactive whiteboards and each SET teacher has their own laptop

- A digital camera is available in the office
- Four classrooms are equipped with a desktop computer.
- The school broadband is wired and was upgraded to fibre optic in 2019. We installed an integrated wireless system in Spring 2020
- We currently use Aladdin to record student data, attendance and assessment results.
- In 2018 and 2019 parent-teacher meetings were organised through Aladdin and Summer Reports were also uploaded to Aladdin
- Payments are received electronically via Aladdin e-Payments system and are made electronically using online banking
- Communication with parents is largely online and paperless; emails, newsletters, use of Aladdin app.
- Ríomhaire Tech. Third to Sixth class attend a computer class in the school once a week for 12 weeks which is run in partnership with a local business

## 2. The focus of this Digital Learning Plan

- Audit of ICT equipment available in the school.
- A focus group session with our Student Council was carried out to elicit the views of older pupils on the use of digital technologies in the school and classroom to reflect on their digital learning experiences
