Nomophobia - fear of being Without your phone.

Phubbing - snubbing someone Who is physically present in favour of looking at your phone.





Sexting - sending or receiving messages of a sexual nature.

Cyberbullying - is bullying behaviour
Which takes place though the use of
electronic means such as email,
mobile phones or posts
on social media.

Ghosting - When a person cuts off all communication with someone they know with zero warning or notice beforehand.



Cyber flashing - sending an unsolicited sexual image to a person / people Without their consent.

The victim is not the subject but rather the recipient.





Sextortion - the threat to release private or embarrassing media of a victim as a form of blackmail.

Catfish - a person who pretends to be someone they are not by posting false information.



Livestreaming - broadcasting a situation in real-time over a social media platform.



Deepfakes - adding someone's face to another person's body.
