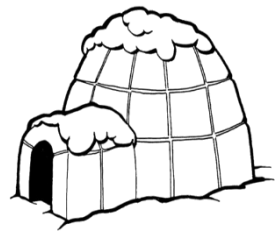
Topic- Polar Lands/Winter
