With the weather getting warmer and the days brighter, we are excited to engage the children in lots of fun outdoor learning activities, including regular visits to our school garden and forest school area. We will look out for minibeasts and begin to learn about life cycles.

Our theme for this month is 'Crazy Creatures' which offers children the chance to explore different habitats, from the jungle to the ocean. There will be lots of imaginative play opportunities as children get to fight dragons, discover 'dinosaur bones' and dress up as jungle explorers.

We are thrilled that we will have a visit from Wee Critters this month to consolidate all this fun learning!

You can help your child at home by helping them to practise writing their name in preparation for Year 1. Continue to read books to your child and point out printed words and their meaning in their environment.

## **May Learning Focus**



**Theme**: Crazy Creatures!

Colours: Yellow, Black, Red

Shape: Rectangle

In May we will learn about all sorts of creatures. We will will observe the lifecycle of butterflies and frogs. We will have real caterpillars and tadpoles at the investigation table. We will become eco-investigators and go for bug hunts in the outdoor area while learning about minibeasts. We will learn about jungle animals, dinosaurs and mythical creatures such as dragons, giants and mermaids!

We will be placing emphasis this month on using mathematical language during play activities. There will be plenty of experiences to consolidate all 2D shapes covered this year.

Lots of opportunities for language development will arise through discussion about weather and new life. We will continue to foster and encourage children to 'write' for themselves.

As the weather improves, we hope to give children the opportunity to work in pairs or teams during outdoor games. We will focus on developing gross motor skills to handle hoops, throw, catch and kick a ball. Children will talk about taking care in the sun.

If you are unsure how to pay for Nursery Fund please don't hesitate to approach the Nursery staff or Mrs Brown for assistance.


# St James's Primary School & Nursery Unit Value of the Month

We can be healthy and well. With the better weather and longer days, children will spend lots of time outdoor learning in the fresh air engaging in physical activities.




### Care in the Sun
