- We wish everyone a safe and happy Easter break.

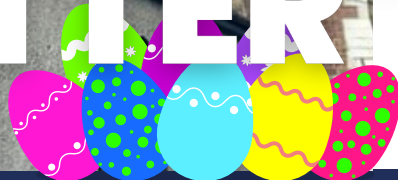
AMBER FLAG

13th April (Sunday 10:15am): Palm Sunday with blessing of the palms and narrative reading of the Passion; Holy Communion

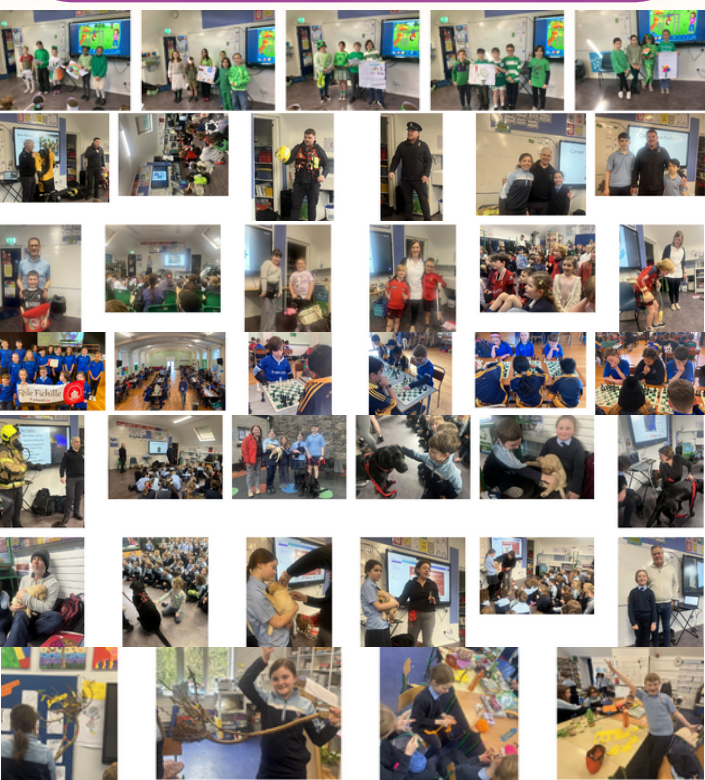
17th April (Thursday 7:30pm): Maundy Thursday Holy Communion and stripping of the altar
