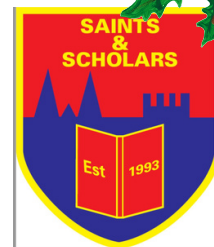

Introduction to Internet Safety Workshop: Protecting Your Child in the Digital World



Monday 9 December at 7pm at the school

In today's digital age, our children are more connected than ever before. While the internet offers a wealth of educational and entertainment opportunities, it also presents potential risks. This workshop will equip you with the knowledge and tools to safeguard your child's online experience.

This session will cover essential topics such as:

- Device Security Basics: Simple steps to lock down devices.
- Parental Controls: How to set limits on screen time, filter inappropriate content, and monitor online activity.
- Online Predators and Cyberbullying: Understanding the dangers and how to protect your child from online threats.
- Digital Citizenship: Teaching your child responsible online behavior, including privacy settings, respectful communication, and avoiding sharing personal information.

This will also be an opportunity to connect with other parents and to share experiences and tips. Feel free to bring your devices along to the workshop and we will endeavour to assist with setup during the evening.
