Schoolbooks Grant

In recognition of the cost of preparing children for the return to primary school each September, the Minister for Education has announced additional funding to provide free schoolbooks, including workbooks and copybooks, for the school year 2024/2025. This scheme will eliminate the cost to parents of providing these resources. Funding is being provided directly to primary schools by the Department to implement the scheme and schools have responsibility for providing schoolbooks, workbooks and copybooks to all children at the start of the school year. All schoolbooks will remain the property of the school so that books can be reused in future years. Schoolbooks will be provided on loan to children for the duration of the 2024/2025 school year and must be returned to school at the end of the school year. Parents are requested to remind their children to take care of their books and keep them in good condition during the year. It is not permitted to write on textbooks unless the class teacher directs otherwise.

There will be some related classroom resources that are not covered by the scheme, i.e. pencils, pens, colouring materials, whiteboard markers, pritt stick etc. Additional details on what items parents will need to supply for the return to school in September 2024 will be communicated to parents before we break for the summer holidays.

School Requisites

Unfortunately, the schoolbooks grant of \notin 80 per pupil (reduced from \notin 96 last year) will not stretch as far as we would all like it to. Therefore, as has been the tradition in our school, we are asking parents for a contribution of \notin 30 per child for <u>art & craft materials and photocopying</u>.

<u>Accelerated Reader</u>, set up by Ms Redahan, has been very well received in our school for almost five years now and teachers, pupils and parents recognise the positive impact the programme has on pupils' attitude to and ability in reading. Accelerated Reader is a graded reading programme tailored to the individual needs of pupils. Pupils complete an online quiz to assess their understanding of a book and progress to higher levels, more challenging material according to their own pace. We hope to run this programme next year in 2nd-6th classes but we require an €8 contribution from parents to maintain our subscription.

Pupil Personal Insurance (Optional)

I will be sending you some information on the Pupil Personal Insurance Scheme. This insurance policy provides you with 24 hour cover for your child, 365 days per year. It is very good value at €9 per child. It is entirely <u>optional</u> for parents/guardians. Please note that you DO NOT need to return the form that I will email to you, I am sending it solely for your information. If you wish to avail of the pupil personal insurance, please pay the cost via Aladdin - we already have all the details that are required on that form so hence there is no reason to return it to the school.

In the event that you need to make a claim on this policy in future, please contact the school for the relevant forms.

School Uniform

A reminder that our school uniform consists of our navy crested jumper, navy tracksuit bottoms and a *grey* polo t-shirt. The school tracksuit can be ordered from <u>https://schoolwearhouse.ie/product-category/scoil-naomh-molaise/</u>

Children are welcome to wear a grey skirt, pinafore or trousers with the crested jumper, if they wish.

If the weather gets very warm, pupils may wear <u>knee-length, navy shorts</u> in a similar material to their tracksuit bottoms. These can be purchased from Dunnes, Penneys, Tesco etc. If your child has outgrown their school tracksuit bottoms or the knees are beyond repair, it is acceptable to turn these into shorts for the summer term.

Only the shorts mentioned above are acceptable. No other type of shorts are permissible (i.e. football shorts, denim shorts, tight fitted shorts etc. are not appropriate and not allowed in school).

We have accumulated a lot of lost property (jumpers & coats) and donated uniforms. Parents are welcome to come into the school between 9-10am and 2-3pm on Tuesday & Wednesday of next week and hopefully, we can find homes for these items.
