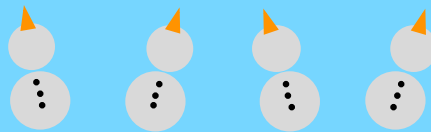
New Climbing Wall

We were delighted to have our application for The Department of Education's Physical Activity in Teaching and Learning Pilot approved. Phase 1 is a literacy focus that involves our children developing their vocabulary and working on character traits for creative writing while working on our new climbing wall. 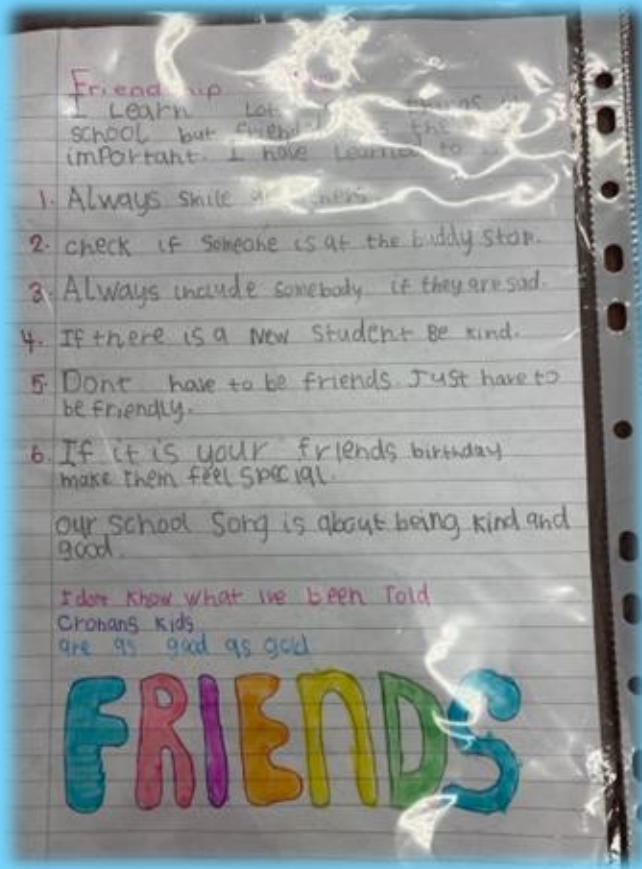

A big thank you to 1st Class, Room 11 for our ki's takeover section for January!

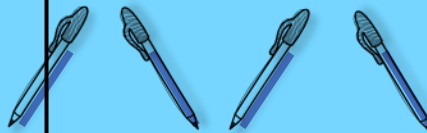


Spring Fair

Attendance and Illness



Parents/Guardians often tell me they are confused about this area. They are aware that we promote excellent attendance in our school. They know we promote every child is a H.E.R.O.: **Here Everyday Ready Ontime.** They also know there are rules about contagious illnesses and children being required to stay home. I will try to make it simple.

ATTENDANCE:

It is the law that I inform TUSLA about any child over the age of 6 that has missed **20 or more days from school**. I submit these reports in January and June. I can also report any child that has missed less than 20 days but I am concerned about their attendance. Once I submit these reports TUSLA then look at the absences - they check if they are explained on Aladdin - please explain all absences on the Aladdin APP (you can retrospectively update them also).

If they are explained they look at the explanation - if they see a reasonable pattern of illnesses - such as tummy bug, tonsillitis, chicken pox etc. they usually acknowledge that these absences were necessary. If they see lots of unexplained absences or absences that seem to them to be unreasonable, they will contact you and begin to work with your family to improve attendance.
