It's been a very busy start to the school year here at Clintyclay Primary School. And the next half term promises to be even busier and will bring some exciting developments.

Some of you who have been doing the school run may have seen work men around the school. They have been carrying out some essential repairs to the school building

As the year progresses these will continue to

ensure that the facilities here at Clintyclay are the best we can possibly

provide for our childen.

Fr Donaghy and the parish have given us the very generous gift of a mobile which subject to planning approval will be on site on the 8th of December.

This building will house our third classroom and is big enough to allow us to provide a dedicated

computer suite and library for the children's use.

It is our hope that once it is set up we will be able to open the computer suite in the evenings for use by

community groups.

We also have plans in place to develop the

outdoor area of the school to include new play equipment.

Hand in hand with this

expansion of the facilities we have had a growth in the population of the school and for the first time in many years we will have well over 40 children on roll.

I am sure you share our delight at the growth in our school enrolment. This increase in numbers allows us for the first time ever in the 125 years of the school being open to employ a third teacher on a temporary basis and to welcome Mrs Mc Geown back to provide some additional assistance in the classroom.

Our Early years children

Reception, Primary 1 and 2 will stay with

Mrs Donnelly in their current classroom

While the children in Key Stage 1

Primary 3 and 4 will be taught by

Miss Cahalane,

primarily in the resource room before moving to the third classroom when the new mobile is on site.

This allow us to

maintain small class sizes and ensure that every child is accessing high quality teaching and learning experiences and the individual care and attention we are committed to providing for every child here at Clintyclay.

These arrangements will be in place from after the midterm break.

With Primary 3 children staying until 3pm.

I believe Miss Cahalane will be a wonderful addition to our school community and has a wealth of talent and love of teaching young children.

I have no doubt you will share this opinion as you get to know her in the coming weeks.

She has spent some time over the last few days working along side Mrs Donnelly and the children in class.

We as a staff are committed to ensuring that the transition from one teacher to the next is very smooth for all the children in Key Stage 1.

We will try to limit all site work to the weekends, and dates when the school is closed to minimize

disruption and to ensure that the health and safety of our children is paramount.



The children in Key Stage 2 have been invited to join in an initiative fully funded by Mid Ulster Council.


The children will be joining with their peers in Killyman and Laghey primary school to learn about each others cultures. Through Music, Movement and Dance.
