School Uniform

Footwear

Shoes/Trainers should be of a comfortable design, low heeled, toe covered and **all black** in colour. Shoes if laced should have black laces.

Hair

Hair should be neat and tidy and worn with no extremes of style or colour.

Long hair should be tied back, particularly for PE.

Hair accessories should be appropriately sized and in keeping with the school colours.

Jewellery

No jewellery, except a watch, to be worn.

For safety reasons, if earrings must be worn, they should be small plain studs. No make-up or nail polish should be worn.

Please note — lots of companies do sensory and adaptive school uniform ranges.

PE

Year I - 4 pupils will only change their shoes when taking part in PE. Please ensure that long hair is tied back on PE days.
