Drama Workshops

Children will take part in two x 1 hour drama workshops, the first of which is today Friday, May 24^{th} and the next one on Wednesday, 5^{th} June around themes of intercultural objects and archaeological exploration and conservation. These workshops will also support the development of a new piece of theatre, Museum of Believing. Many thanks to Heather Rose (a parent in our school) and her team for offering to deliver these workshops to the children in Cloonloo N.S. It is rare to find a show designed for the small spaces and such a wide age range as we have at our school, and it can be difficult to take our students to a theatre due to busing costs, and limited target ages of most shows so this is a wonderful opportunity for pupils in our school.

Food Dudes Week - 27th to 31st May

Children will take part in the Food Dudes Healthy Eating Programme next week. This programme aims to encourage children to eat more fruit and vegetables. Next week we will receive 5 days of fruit and vegetables. Children will be encouraged to eat or at least sample different fruit and vegetables each day. A series of videos will be shown in each class room and activities will be completed during the week. A letter with further information about the programme has been sent home with children.

Buddy Reading

As part of our Buddy Reading Programme for 6 weeks, children from the junior and senior room read to each other on Fridays.

Hatching Eggs

There is great excitement in school as we eagerly await our eggs to hatch. We have 8 eggs in an incubator and fingers crossed they will start to hatch next Tuesday/Wednesday. Thanks to Ms. Whiteside who teaches in Carn N.S. for bringing us the eggs and incubator.

Green Schools

Attendance Awards

We have introduced a new element to our Attendance Awards. The names of those children who have been in school for a full week (5 days) will be entered into a draw at the end of month assembly. Each child will potentially have 4 chances each month. There will be two prizes each month one from each room. The children have been given the chance to tell us what prizes they would like through our Student Council. Days missed by children who have diagnosed medical conditions and who need to attend for appointments or are ill as a result of their diagnosis will not be counted.

Congratulations to those pupils who received an attendance award at our March assembly. Prizes were given to pupils who had not missed any days from when we returned to school in January until we got our Easter holidays.
