We welcome everyone back to school and hope to make a positive start to 2026 reflecting on the theme of 'Gratitude and Appreciation' for the month of January.

We will be helping the children to notice and talk about what they can be grateful for in their lives and how we can show appreciation for things.

Gratitude is when you feel thankful for something good that has happened in your life. It's like when someone gives you a gift, helps you with your homework, or shares their toys with you. You feel happy and grateful because they did something nice! Appreciation is similar to gratitude. It means you recognise and value the good things around you. For example, when you notice how delicious your favourite meal is, or when you see how hard your teacher works to help you learn, you feel appreciation for those things.


Gratitude and Appreciation are important as they make us feel happy: When we think about the things, we are grateful for, we often feel happier and more positive. Saying thank you and showing appreciation helps us build strong friendships. Friends like to know that we notice their kindness.

Being appreciative can also create a positive environment: When we express gratitude, it encourages others to be kind, too. It helps everyone feel good!

We will be discussing how we can show Gratitude and Appreciation in many ways:

- Say Thank You: A simple "thank you" can make someone's day better.
- Write a Note: You can write a little note to tell someone why you appreciate them.
- Give Compliments: Telling someone they did a great job or that you like their work shows appreciation.
- Help Others: Sometimes, helping someone can be a way to show you appreciate what they do for you. Encouraging our children to practice gratitude and appreciation can help them develop a positive outlook and strong relationships with others.

ENROLMENT for Year 1 in September 2026

If your child's birthday falls between 2nd July 2021 and 1st July 2022 inclusive, they must commence primary school in September 2026.

Our Open Day will take place on Friday 9th January at 10am and we look forward to welcoming you and your child to St. Dympna's to view our school.

If your child is starting primary school in September 2026, you can apply for their place at St. Dympna's Primary School, Dromore, online from 12 noon on Wednesday 7th January 2026. The closing date for primary one application will be on Wednesday 21st January 2026 at 12noon. Late applications will only be accepted if a place becomes available in Year 1. Birth certificates must also be left into the school office before the closing date.

If you know someone with a child ready for school, please make sure they are aware that the application process is commencing on 7th January 2026.

POST PRIMARY TRANSFER

If your child was born between 2 July 2014 and 1 July 2015 you will need to apply for their Post Primary school place for September 2026.

Admissions criteria for all post primary schools is currently available on the EA website. Online applications will open at 12 noon on Tuesday 27th January 2025 and will close on Thursday 19th February 2026 at 12 noon. More information will be available in due course to support you in making an application.
