Classwork

In Primary Seven our work is presented in topic form to tie all areas of learning together as much as possible.

This leaflet outlines what we will be covering in November / December in Numeracy and Literacy and through the theme of “**W3—Who? What? Where?**” so that home learning can be organised to support your child if you wish.

Please Note: - Not all aspects of each subject are included in this document and all children work at different levels of ability.

Numeracy

Number – Prime numbers, multiplying large numbers, algebra

Measure— Time, timetables, scales

Handling Data – decision trees, reading and drawing graphs and pie charts.

Literacy

Class novel – A Christmas Carol

Punctuation Work – direct speech, adjectives and apostrophes.

Writing – Instruction writing.

Shared Reading— Analysis of setting and plot. Character comparisons.

We will develop comprehension skills each week, focusing on scanning and retrieval of information. We also complete a guided reading session

each week where pupils will read in a small groups and complete related activities.

World Around Us

Physical Study – Europe and European countries.

Victorians – Life in the City, life in school and Victorian Christmas.

Habitats – animal adaptation and different habitats.

Project Based Learning – Board game design

Personal Development and Mutual Understanding

PDMU this term will involve the pupils looking at how to sustain their health, growth and wellbeing and coping safely and efficiently with their environment. We will also be taking a look at friendships and how we can develop these relationships.

Using ICT

Pupils will continue to develop their ICT skills through the use of the computer suite and ipads in the classroom.

We will research European countries and create informative powerpoints about them.

Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities

TSPC is a cross—curricular aspect of the primary curriculum. Through numeracy, literacy and other areas of the curriculum the pupils will become engaged in problem solving activities and discussions which will require them to take on different roles and develop confidence.
