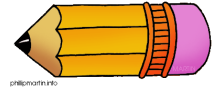
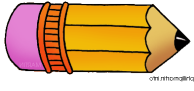

## Classwork



In Primary Six our work is presented in topic form to tie all areas of learning together as much as possible.

This leaflet outlines what we will be covering in November / December in Numeracy and Literacy and through the theme of **Life (Similarities & Differences)**.

**Please Note:** - *Not all aspects of each subject are included in this document and all children work at different levels of ability.*

### Numeracy

**Number** - continuing multiplication tables and division, rounding to nearest 10, 100, 1000, prime numbers, square numbers, factors, common factors, multiples, dividing ThHTU by a single digit, negative numbers.

**Measure**— find information from timetables; 24 hour clock

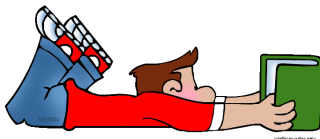
**Shape & Space** - measure and draw angles using a protractor

### Literacy

**Sentence Work** - Alphabetical order (4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> letter), phrases, subject and verb agreement, adverbs.



**Grammar** - alphabetical order, collective nouns, masculine and feminine, phrases, subject and verb agreement, adverbs.



**Class Novel** - 'Coraline' by Neil Gaiman

**Spellings**—We will continue to work through our spelling booklets in class with extra activities being completed at home each night.

Please also encourage your child to read for at least ten minutes each night

## World Around Us

**Rainforests** - A study of rainforest animals and plants.



**Religions** - Comparing and contrasting different religions, Viking, Christian and Hindu. We will be organising a Diwali festival day in school where the children will dress up, take part in traditional dance, make Indian crafts and sample Indian food.



**Living Things** - Life cycles, identifying trees by their characteristics, flowers and reproduction, seed dispersal, vertebrates and invertebrates



## Personal Development and Mutual Understanding

This will involve the pupils looking at the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child including a wider look at general human rights, diversity and different cultures. We will be continuing with circle time and the Special Box

## Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities

TSPC is a cross-curricular aspect of the primary curriculum. Through numeracy, literacy and other areas of the curriculum the pupils will become engaged in problem solving activities and discussions which will require them to take on different roles and develop confidence.
