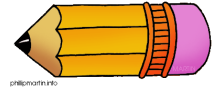
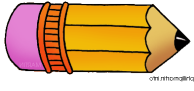

This leaflet outlines what we will be covering in November / December in Numeracy and Literacy and through the theme of **Houses and Homes** so that home learning can be organised to support your child if you wish.

Please Note: - *Not all aspects of each subject are included in this document and all children work at different levels of ability.*

Numeracy

Number - explore and use a 100 square to appreciate order of numbers, investigate odd and even numbers, carry out shopping activities by giving change from 10p and 15p

Data Handling - collect information and record in a table

Shape & Space - explore the relationship between 2D and 3D shapes

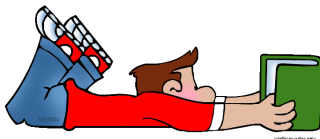
Measure—tell the time in hours and half hours on the analogue clock

Literacy

Reading- recognise speech marks in a text, retell familiar stories from memory, recognise high frequency words in context

Writing - write their own acrostic and shape poems, recall and retell the Christmas story, discuss their homes and write a description of them

Sounds— , and words with the following sound patterns :
ff, ss and zz, ck, ch, sh

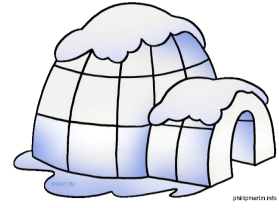


Children will be sent home their group reading book, an unseen text and a class library book and we encourage you to read with your child every night.

World Around Us

As our topic is **Houses and Homes** we will look at the following areas:

- kitchen items which use electricity and be aware of the dangers; littering and recycling; natural materials in the environment; the journey of a letter; homes in hot and cold countries; compare and contrast homes over time; investigate the development of modern household appliances



Personal Development and Mutual Understanding

PDMU this term, will involve the pupils looking at relationships within their family and also within friendship groups. They will become aware

of their contribution to home and school life and the responsibilities that can bring. We will be examining the variety of roles in the family and the contribution made by each

member. The children should gain an understanding that they can take on some responsibility in their family and friendship groups. We will be developing ways of expressing how they feel, knowing what to do if they feel lonely or sad and knowing how to treat others.
