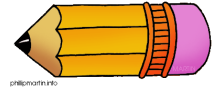
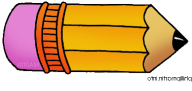

Classwork



In Primary Five our work is now presented in topic form to tie all areas of learning together as much as possible.

This leaflet outlines what we will be covering in November / December in Numeracy and Literacy and through the theme of **A Different World** so that home learning can be organised to support your child if you wish.

Please Note: - *Not all aspects of each subject are included in this document and all children work at different levels of ability.*

Numeracy

Number - Looking at properties of numbers, working with Th H T U adding and subtracting. Multiplying HTU/TU by U, ordering and rounding numbers Multiplication/division facts to 10.

Shape & Space - angles

Measure— Telling the Time to 5 minute intervals

Literacy

Sentence Work— Consolidation of punctuation marks.

Grammar - Nouns, proper nouns, verbs, adjectives, verb tense

Sounds— continuing our spellings work week by week. Daily and home activities.

Shared Reading— summarising, paragraphs, editing, connectives.

Children will have access to Home Reads. They are picked independently and we encourage you to read with your child when possible.



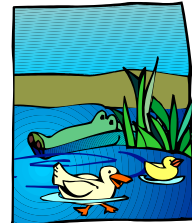
World Around Us

Cultures— The Jewish religion, celebration of Hanukkah, Hanukkah crafts.



Wetlands - What is a wetland, living conditions, local Wildfowl and Wetlands Trust, water creatures, habitat.

Vertebrates and Invertebrates— classifying animals and plants, making models.



Personal Development and Mutual Understanding



PDMU this term will involve the pupils looking at how to make good choices. They shall go through lessons that involve decision making methods and techniques. They will investigate and understand their roles and responsibilities in the community.

Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities

TSPC is a cross—curricular aspect of the primary curriculum. Through numeracy, literacy and other areas of the curriculum the pupils will more confident in social and interpersonal situations. They will experience different roles in group situations and take responsibility for a range of tasks.

They will work with peers to reach agreements and begin to manage disagreements.
