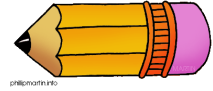
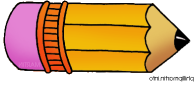

This leaflet outlines what we will be covering in March/April in Numeracy and Literacy, through the theme of "The Living World". This is to aid home learning.

Please Note: - *Not all aspects of each subject are included in this document and all children work at different levels of ability.*

Numeracy

Number—Explore addition and subtraction facts to 10
e.g. $6 - \underline{\quad} = 3$

The children will learn to use ordinal number to 10th.
They will find the difference between two sets and develop this language e.g. the difference between 7 and 2 is 5.
They will begin to estimate their answers.
Continue shopping activities within 20p and begin to explore change from 10p.

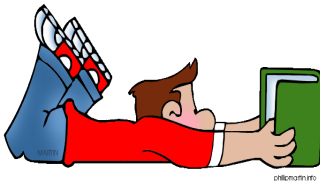
Measure - Measure distance using hands, feet, cubes, books etc.

Order three or four objects for length.
Use arbitrary units for measuring capacity.



Literacy

Children will have access to Home Reads and we encourage you to read with your child when possible.



Literacy

Reading— Continue to answer questions about their reading books—both literal and inferential.

Explain the difference between fiction and non-fiction books and the uses for each.

Be aware of the 5 vowels and the term consonant.

Put words in alphabetical order.

Read with increasing fluency and expressions.

Find words with endings—ed, ing.

Identify sh, th, ch and wh in words and know their sounds.

Compare good versus evil in their stories.

Writing— Continue to 'have a go' at writing high frequency words independently.

Begin to use endings 'ing' and 's' correctly. Begin to use capital letters and full stops in their writing.

Recount a familiar story in writing.

Talking and Listening—

Explain their views to others in a small group and decide how to report back to the class.

World Around Us

- To differentiate between wild animals and pet animals.

- To know how to care for pets.

- To name familiar animals and their young.



- To know the parts of a plant and how seeds grow.

- Explore spring time and spring changes.

- Know that plants grow in different

habitats.
