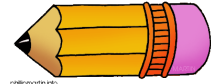
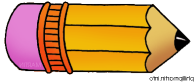


Shaping the future with learning,

In Primary Five our work is now presented in topic form to tie all areas of learning together as much as possible.

This leaflet outlines what we will be covering in March / April in Numeracy and Literacy and through the theme of **The World I live in** so that home learning can be organised to support your child if you wish.

Please Note: - *Not all aspects of each subject are included in this document and all children work at different levels of ability.*

Numeracy

Number - Working with Th H T U adding, subtracting, dividing and multiplying. Multiplication/division facts to 10. Fractions, equivalence, simplifying, roman numerals, place value, money

Geometry - Properties of shape

Measure— Perimeter, area, volume and capacity.

Literacy

Sentence Work - Revising capital letters and full stops.

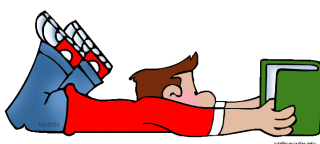
Grammar - Nouns, proper nouns, verbs, adjectives, verb tense, adverbs.

Sounds— continuing our Spellings work week by week.

Daily and home activities.

Shared Reading— adverts, persuasive texts, summarising, work on suitable endings.

Children will have access to Home Reads. They are picked independently and we encourage you to read with your child when possible.



World Around Us

History—Egypt now and then, Ancient Egypt: The Nile, housing, farming, writing, numbers, religions and burial.

Geography—waste, pollution and recycling. The causes and effects. How we can help, including a re-using project.

Science— Electricity—mains and battery operated equipment, dangers and safety work and practical circuit making.



Personal Development and Mutual Understanding

PDMU this term will involve the pupils using the 'Helping Hands' programme to explore their own emotions, self-confidence, self-esteem and how we develop as an individual.

Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities

TSPC is a cross—curricular aspect of the primary curriculum. Through numeracy, literacy and other areas of the curriculum the pupils will more confident in social and interpersonal situations. They will experience different roles in group situations and take responsibility for a range of tasks. They will work with peers to reach agreements and begin to manage disagreements.
