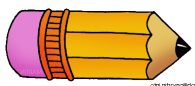

Classwork



This leaflet outlines what we will be covering in March / April in Numeracy and Literacy and through the theme of **Understanding Our World** so that home learning can be organised to support your child if you wish.

Please Note: - *Not all aspects of each subject are included in this document and all children work at different levels of ability.*

Numeracy

Number - continuing tables revision; improper fractions, mixed numbers; decimals and how they relate to percentages; Roman numerals.

Measure— calculating perimeters of rectangles and compound shapes; finding areas of squares and rectangles, including areas of irregular shapes.

Shape & Space - revising 2D & 3D shapes and their properties; working out missing angles in a right angle, a straight line and a complete turn.



Literacy

Grammar - prepositions, conjunctions, abbreviations, suffixes.

Spellings— Units 11 to 14 in their spelling books



Children are asked to read their chosen Home Read book for 10 minutes per night .We encourage you to read with your child as much as possible.

World Around Us



Materials - Solids, liquids and gases - looking at natural and man made materials and their origin. Building and experimenting with circuits including making a circuit quiz game. Safety with electricity and how electricity works. Also continuing to look at aspects of weather and volcanoes / earthquakes.



Rainforests - we will look at the raw materials from the rainforest and how we use them in our lives daily - food, wood, medicines etc.

St Mark's- looking into the role of the church in the world we live in - our relationship with St Mark's and its history .

Personal Development and Mutual Understanding

This will involve the pupils looking at feelings (put downs), dealing with difficult situations, making decisions, cultural symbols in NI and passing judgements.

We will be continuing with circle time and the Special Box



Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities



TSPC is a cross—curricular aspect of the primary curriculum. Through numeracy, literacy and other areas of the curriculum the pupils will become engaged in problem solving activities and discussions which will require them to take on different roles and develop confidence.
