Dr. Chan, an Honorary Clinical Associate Professor of Department of Psychiatry in The University of Hong Kong, specializes in psychiatry. She is the former Chief of Service and Head of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and Psychotherapy of the Department of Psychiatry in Queen Mary Hospital.

During the seminar, she discussed the sources of stress for parents, the relationship between parental stress and children's behavior, ways to relieve stress and methods for finding one's meaning. The seminar was well received by the audience, and many parents raised questions regarding the positive parenting approach.

“Fly Your Dreams: Paper Airplane Contest” – Soaring Hopes & Wishes

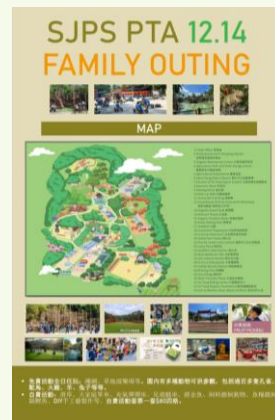
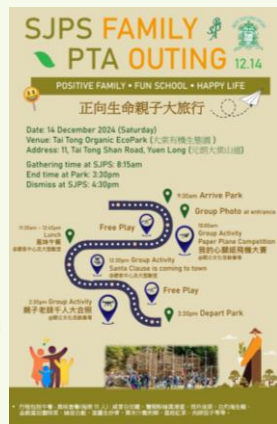
