Delay, delay, delay – excuses, excuses, excuses. That’s what CA State Parks has been doing for over 10 years regarding the particulate matter air pollution from the Oceano Dunes OHV State Park. And....it’s continuing even though they have signed a Stipulated Order of Abatement of a nuisance and agreed to mandated annual mitigation.

Instead of adhering to the scientific-based rules set down and agreed to by them, State Parks continues to ask for “more time” and less action. In the meantime, the citizens living south of the OHV State Park continue to suffer from the particulate matter pollution, altering their lives to stay indoors, purchase expensive air filtration systems, and visit doctors to take care of illnesses caused by the pollution. The workers in the fields have no choice but to work outdoors in spite of the pollution. Children are highly at risk. This is a public health hazard that can be solved. It is shameful that Nipomo, CA often has the WORST air quality in the entire United States.

This delay tactic has gone on long enough. On Nov. 18, the Hearing Board has the power to enforce the Stipulated Order of Abatement.

California State Parks has a legal obligation to complete the agreed-upon mandated steps to reduce the pollution by the agreed upon dates.
