Dear Hearing Board Members,

As I mentioned at the last APCD Board meeting, convening the Hearing Board is imperative because of the lack of mitigation progress in 2019. We are now working to save the 2020 mitigation progress. State Parks must have specific direction on how much annual mitigation is necessary as was done in 2018. We have seen no further emissive acres closed since your last action, only planting within existing fencing. That is necessary, but it should not be counted twice as acres mitigated.


Although 2019 was a mild wind year, Nipomo found itself in the #1 position on the AirNow "Highest Five" hourly chart over a dozen times. There is no reason that should continue as the Oso Flaco monitor showed fewer than 10 State exceedances this year. All the public wants is the same level of PM 10 as the background level present at Oso Flaco. The CDF monitor had over 50 State exceedances.

I sincerely hope that the Hearing Board will take substantive action to abate the nuisance. The revised steps in the Petition to Modify the SOA will not be enough. The OHV Division will continue to play games with the APCD, if a higher authority does not step in. Please take action to get this process back on track.
