To the members of the APCD Hearing Board:

As a nine year resident in Nipomo with increasing lung problems, I am very concerned to hear of proposals to reduce stipulated agreements about reducing the dust plume coming from the Oceano Dunes OHV riding area to my HOME.

It has been 10 YEARS of arguing, denying air quality monitor results, anything to continue the disruption of life to area residents because of the hazards of OHV riding and the damage to our environment and health. There have already been 57 violations of CA State Air Quality Standard for PM10 from January 1 to September 30, 2022. This alone should convince you that there is further need for dust mitigation.

I'm tired of having to sit inside my home with windows closed and two special air filtration systems running on days when the air quality in my area shows PM10 pollution. I'm tired to having to take medication and using an inhaler to help me breathe. I'm tired of not being able to walk on a local beach because of the danger from OHV riders. I'm tired of seeing the natural dunes and vegetation being torn up by OHV riders.

DO NOT MAKE CHANGES to the current Stipulated Order of Abatement. Listen to the experts from our own local SLO County APCD. The lives and welfare of residents in the South County of SLO, the environment, and the use of our local beach by ALL should be your ONLY concerns!!
