Tier 1 Engines 750+ hp and Tier 2 Engines Manufactured Prior to 2009

Phase-Out Deadline: December 31, 2021

LOW USE DESIGNATION OPTION

Designate as low use (<u>200</u> hours or less) at least 6 months before the phase-out date to exclude from phase-out. For Tier 3 engines registered in PERP, low use engine designation can only be done in January of any year prior to the phase-out. Don't wait until the last minute – late designations will not be accepted.

For engines permitted by the SLO County Air Pollution Control District (District), submit an application to modify the existing Permit to Operate by the deadline below. Application forms are available on www.slocleanair.org.
