Pomegranate ceramics are often used as a souvenir. It is a cretan habit when a guest arrives he cracks a pomegranate (called RODI) at the entrance door as a symbol of happiness wishes to the owners.



Daytrip "ARKADI"

MARGARITES village of potteries

When passing Rethymnon exit the national road, make a first stop at this little village on the hills. A dozen of art shops selling ceramics and pottery at very reasonable prices. you can also walk down the gorge for those who want.

ELEFTERNA ruines

Just exiting Margarites in the next village the remains of a 800BC city with a museum and a graveyard for warriors.

ARKADI monastery



The most important monastery on Crete in the 1900 originates from the 5th century and is today a symbol of resistance to the Turks. Certainly worth a visit.

Prima Plora@ Rethymnon



A little out of the center but right at the seafront and with a wonderful view on the city is located PRIMA PLORA. Fantastic dining with "pimped" greek foods, ideal for a romantic evening or celebrations.

Mountain tea

Known to boost the immune system, often served with honey and lemon.



AMARI dam

Further uphill towards mount Psiloritis (the highest on Crete 2450m), one will pass the artificial dam containing the biggest water supply on the island. A number of years ago the lake was in the spotlights because a crocodile lived in it (not anymore).



Mountain village SPILI

Known for its water fountains, SPILI is worth a small stop in order to have a drink or a small lunch. Don't forget to buy some honey or the famous Greek mountain tea.
