## Membership and Dues Information

IADR membership categories, as defined by section A.2 of the IADR Bylaws, are as follows:

**Member** – A person who is conducting, has conducted, or who is interested in the furtherance of research in any branch of science or in fields related to dental science. Members shall have the full rights and privileges of membership and are eligible to vote and to hold office in the Association.

**Student Member** – A person who is a student currently enrolled in a recognized academic institution who does not hold an academic appointment and who is interested in dental research. Student members must become Members when eligible or be dropped from membership. Individuals may be classified at the Student level for no more than 8 years. The Student Member shall have all the rights and privileges of membership but shall have no vote.

IADR membership is based on a calendar year (January 1 – December 31). During the months of July and August, you may pay half of the IADR membership annual dues. If you join from September through December, your membership and related items will be activated the following January.

## Membership and Publications Refund Policy

- Refunds due to an error by the IADR/AADR will be processed immediately and in full.
- A \$20 processing fee will be withheld from all other refunds.
- Overpayment of \$30 or less will be treated as a contribution and will not be refunded.
- Refunds will normally be sent in the same manner as the original payment (i.e., checks will be issued for payments by check, and credit cards will be credited for payments by credit card). If a wire transfer is requested, IADR/AADR will pass on all wire transfer fees to the recipient.
- Please allow 6-8 weeks for your refund to be processed.
- No refunds for membership or member journal subscriptions will be given after the IADR General Session each year, according to the IADR Constitution & Bylaws.
- IADR/AADR reserves the right to review each membership for the appropriateness of the selected category, make any necessary corrections and charge your credit card the difference in membership fees.
