

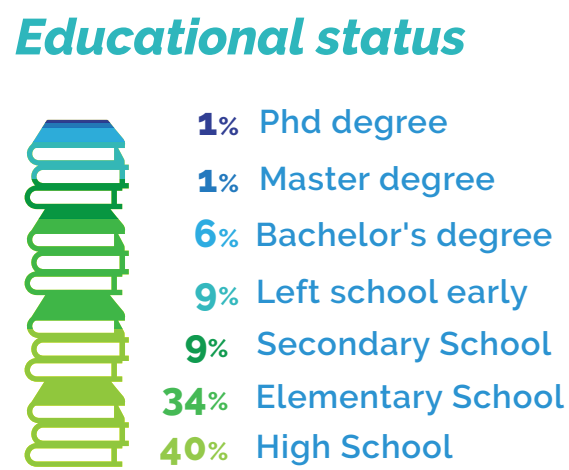
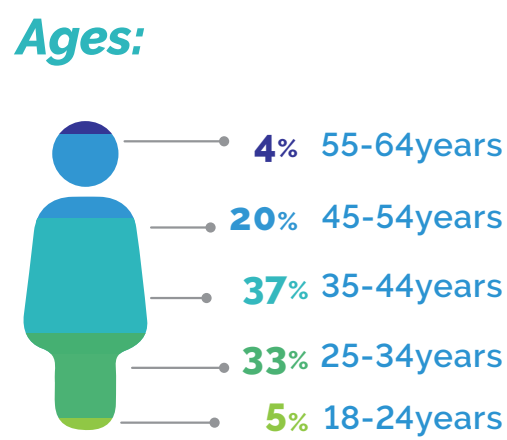


FREE TO CODE

The 3rd newsletter will bring fresh updates on what's been done on the **FREE TO CODE** project. As we go deeper into the project it came the time to create a connection between the inmates and the project, learning its goals and encouraging them to be part of it.

This said, the Consortium set off to understand, each in their own acting area, where in the ICT dimension the inmates put themselves in. A survey was carried out in April/19 in **six prisons**: one in **Portugal**, one in **Greece**, one in **Romania** and three in **Belgium**. We sought to understand their digital skills, their ICT educational level, how and if they are familiar with coding and, finally, if they are willing to participate in a coding training. These are some of the inspiring results gathered.
