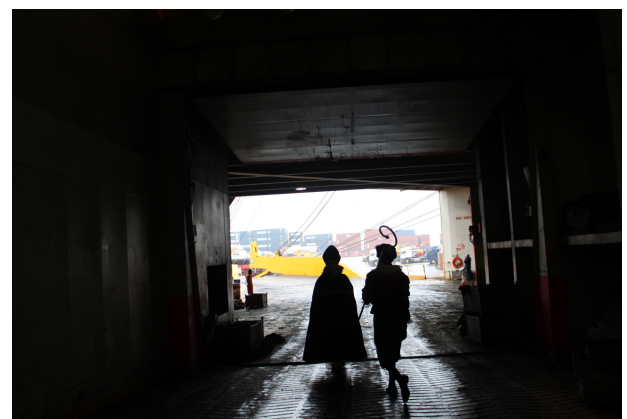
Sinterklaas in de Haven

Christmas in Seamen's Club Stella Maris

"Go tell it on the mountain, over the hills and everywhere; Go tell it on the mountain that Jesus Christ is born!"

With the chaplains of all the seamen's missions -representing the different Christian denominations- we presided the liturgical celebration in the feast-hall of the Antwerp Seafarers' Centre, Italiëlei 72. Together with volunteers, members of the board and seafarers (more than 60 participants) we sang and prayed on Christmas' Eve that peace and fellowship may reign in our homes, on board, in the city and the world for all people of good will, with respect for all races, nations, cultures and religions.



In co-operation with the Antwerp Harbour Hotel (Noorderlaan 100) we offered sandwiches, soup and warm drinks as "Glühwein" and chocolate. On board of the vessels the dishes in Christmas' time are very special in accordance with the different national traditions. Also the Christmas decoration is very creative with a lot of bright and colored lights, showing our wish to dissipate all kind of darkness in our personal life and environment.

There arrives Santa Claus with his presents for every seaman, but... first sing a popular song of your country in your native language! Very funny to see how they find their roots and sing in Russian, Chinese, Tagalog, German, Indian language, ...**During Christmas' Eve and Christmas' Day** (also with Mass celebration) **we hand over 250 packets** with a woolly beret, scarf or sweater, socks, a bottle-opener with knife, sweeties and our calendar of the Apostleship of the Sea. Of course, photos and recorded messages with Santa where sent immediately at home using our Wi-Fi or internet cards.



About **100 seafarers** returned at 23 hrs. back to their ships to the left or right bank by our transport for free in tree busses. As you notices, happy and encouraged to take up their duty and ready to sail around the world. **In the Christmas' week about 350 crewmembers visited our seamen's club.**



Our ship visitors from the Antwerp Seafarers' Centre and the Antwerp Harbour Hotel also **distribute 1700 (small) packets with Christmas gifts on board** of the vessels for all crewmembers during the period off Christmas. They didn't have a chance to go ashore. We also distribute on request a lot of warm coats for wintertime and now we are out of stock. Especially seafarers from tropical countries can't bring it from their homeland. So, if you can provide us second hand winter coats for men, you are mostly welcome! The thankfulness of our beloved seafarers is the best payment to be on their side, day after day.
