District 27 now has again 75 Clubs

plus 2 Golden Z-Clubs and 2 e-Clubs

Last weekend we chartered **ZC Elbland** on the right side of the river Elbe.

It's a disembodiment of the ZC Dresden which is located at the left side of the Elbe.

This Club has existed since 1993. The Charter of the new club, Zonta Club of Elbland, No. 2032, was celebrated in Meißen.

The SOM Committee has identified a potential service project in the local community where the new club is going to be chartered.

The participants gained insight into various companies and industries. They were able to learn how good their social media skills are and how much their own openness to technology is needed in every area of today's working life.

In the early evening the Charter was celebrated with ZIP Ute Scholz, the AD of Area 07 and the Governor of D27 and approx.40 Zontians.



ZC Elbland has now 14 members, three of them are male.

At the dinner afterwards, AD Birgit Gutmann-Oks handed over the red lantern to the new club. An old custom. This lantern is always passed on from the last chartered club to the next newly chartered club.



The members of the new club organized a very interesting guided tour to the manufacture of the porcelain, a wonderful concert in the cathedral of Meißen and a dinner in one of the oldest wineries of the town.

I.Firstly:

Zontians worldwide attended the annual Commission on the Status of Women (CSW67) March 5-17,

held in person in NYC and with hundreds of workshops available online. I was able to attend online.

The priority theme for the forum was Innovation and Technological Change, and Education in the Digital Age for Achieving Progress Toward Gender Equality.

The focus of the CSW annual session was to discuss the progress of women and the challenges they face to set policies and to set global standards. The session convened Ministers, high-level government officials, and civil society representatives at the United Nations in New York. CSW67 held over 700 events on a 24/7 basis; there were 400 virtual events and 350 events held in venues in and around the United Nations. Zonta International has consultative status at the United Nations and hosted/cohosted many events including:

- An in-person discussion on Innovation and its Transformative Impact on all Aspects of Gender Equality hosted in collaboration with UNICEF USA.
- Say Her Name: Artists Speak Out Against Gender-Based Violence
- Violence Against Women in Leadership.

The outcome of the Commission's consideration of the priority theme during its 67th session took the form of agreed conclusions, to be negotiated by all Member States.

II. Secondly:

Our 2nd DB Meeting in Antwerp.

- Our treasurer Géraldine Welvaert presented a budget control based on the proposed budget in Leuven and the adapted budget proposal presented in Hanover and explained it in detail.
- The number of club members is decreasing, so less money will come in and apart from that the board is increasing with growing numbers of committees for the given tasks. Consequently more money is needed for the required reimbursements, which will cause financial deficits in the future.
- It is becoming increasingly difficult to organize DB meetings and district conferences with the available budget, the travel costs for the participants included. Creative ideas to solve the problem are urgently needed.

Our Lt. Governor

- **Ria Matthijssens** will offer a workshop (Creative membership) at the next DC and asked for our feedback and examples of best practice.
- AD Karolien Dewitte said that "young clubs"attract new members more easily, but might lose them after two or three years. When they leave often time problems are mentioned, but there are obviously other reasons. How can we attract, include and make them feel good in the organization?

- Reports and goals of the Area Directors

 The area directors presented their main work areas, implemented projects, clubs information and further plans for this biennium.
- The topic with the majority of votes is "City Walk" (Area 01)
 The walk is part of the "Orange Week" a campaign to raise awareness of violence against women and girls and to end gender-based violence.
- The second topic is "Elevator Pitch" (Area 05) Zontians have workshops to find out what important facts have to be provided about Zonta. The information is collected in a power point presentation and members can memorize important facts about Zonta to be readily available if needed.
- Area 02 has a button with the questions: "I am a Zontian, ask me why." (Je suis Zontienne. Demandez-moi pourquoi.) It helps to awaken interest in Zonta and start a talk.
- The third topic is "Social Media" (Area 07)
 The "Union deutscher Zonta Clubs" is working on this topic. Each club should have a committee for social media. Short videos play an important role, too.

We also spoke about the different awards:

• Young Women in Public Affairs/Awardees (Carola Schäfer) Zonta International offers 37 awards of US\$5,000 each to 32 districts. The five biggest districts get US\$ 5000 for a second winner. District 27 will have two winners. This year there are 70 applications and 25 club winners.



- Women in Business (Dr. Ute Noeske)

 Invitation of five winners to the DC in Luxembourg
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 The following costs will be reimbursed to awardees participating in
 the district conference: registration 50 €, travel costs and 150 € for
 accommodation (two nights).
- In this biennium STEM is again a pilot project and not part of the fundraising goals of ZI.

District 27 supports the motion of other districts to convert STEM into a scholarship in 2024.

2024 Amelia Earhart Fellowship

\$10,000 Fellowships are awarded by Zonta International each year, to "women pursuing full-time Ph.D./doctoral degrees in aerospace engineering and spaces sciences. Applications are submitted directly to Zonta International and are evaluated per the stated criteria. The 2024 AE Fellowship applications will be open July 2023, and must be submitted by November 15, 2023.

DC in Luxembourg (Claire van der Ent Braat for her team)

9. European Interdistrict Zonta Seminar 28 – 30 April 2023

Women and Finance – between Challenges and Chances The seminar offered a weekend of inspiring panel discussions and workshops with female entrepreneurs and leaders on the brink of a new digital era.

An extraordinary panel discussion took place with Prof. Dr. Alexandra Niessen-Ruenzi, Dr. Barbara Böhnlein, Dr. Ricarda Engelmeier, Dr. Katharina Barley, Karin Nordmeyer (UN Women), Katharina Gehra, CEO & Co-Founder of Immutable Insight, hosted by Bettina Weiguny, ZC Bad Soden/Kronberg.

They all discussed the questions: Women in finance are still an exception, especially at the top.

But it's more than that – women seem to avoid financial questions in general, even at home. So what are we dealing with here – a gender bias or personal preferences?

- What is it that prevents women from founding a brand new Fintech company?
- Why do women leave personal investments, tax and pension matters to their partners?
- And most important of all: What does it take to change that?
- Or is the young generation of women already doing math?

The answers in this discussion were very different. The following are some of them:

- Women look more into sustainable investments;
- Homophily: men give men the money;



- Men have more risk appetite;
- The consciousness of women has to be developed;
- o It takes a long way to change the Norma rules;
- What helps are role models;
- We need more he for she;
- o To look for alliance is also an intergenerational work;
- The need of financial education;
- To be come more aware, looking holistic.

It was really inspiring to see and to listen to all this dedicated and enthusiastic ladies!
